accepting and agreeing with the Department of
Education on their policies. I must thank the
Speaker for her continued hard work and support
that she has given me through these difficult
weeks in dealing with the Department of Education.

I don't agree with the Department, as I said a number of times, but I do thank Deputy Mayor Dennis Walcott and the Department for the time that they have spent in the past month giving attention to this matter as well. I'd like to thank my colleagues in this body for your continued support. I'm grateful.

I'm voting no and let me clear, I want a school in Maspeth but I just do not agree with this plan. In an effort to alleviate the traffic and the transit concerns raised by my community I asked the Department of Education to compromise on the plan to allow this school to better address the needs and concerns of my community.

They have given District 24

preference but they have not given a small area to

guarantee those who live across the street and

down the block from the school a seat in the

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school. And as the plan stands now, it does not have the approval of the Community Education Council. It does not have the approval of the Community Board. And with that -- it does not also have the approval of the local State elected

officials and that is why have to vote no.

CHAIRPERSON COMRIE: Okay. I just want to make a comment before we proceed with the vote. This has been an interesting hearing. sitting on these Public Siting hearings for schools in, as the -- since -- to find, to deal with the issues of congestion, to deal with the issues of traffic, to deal with the issues of zoning, have all been issues that have been presented to us before. I can say that as Council Member Arroyo has said, I want to congratulate Council Member Crowley, she really has gotten concessions that no other Council Member has gotten before.

To get a zoning preference for the school, any type of zoning preferences is a major opportunity. To get an opportunity to ensure that children from your community get to be in the school is something that's unprecedented. And I have to say as a Queens-wide representative,

something that other parts of Queens will be very upset about. When we have schools that are underperforming, their children would like to be in--

5 and have other options.

So I want to congratulate Council

Member Crowley. She will also be part of the

programming of the school which is unprecedented.

I was told to ask you to make the school a LGBT

theme school as an April Fool's joke, since I

didn't get to do an April Fool's joke yesterday,

but back to the issue at hand.

We are--we have a real issue with seating of high schools, seating schools in the community. If we delay this school being built it will be delayed for up to two years. While I believe that there are other sites in the Maspeth area that would better warrant a school, I think we could also get those sites now to build additional schools. We need more seats in northern Queens. We need more seats in Queens altogether. To deny the opportunity to have this school being built right now in a critical time when we are--every school in northern Queens is 110% capacity I think does the entire Borough a

disservice and especially the residents of
northern Queens.

With that I'm going to have to respectfully ask the Committee to vote for this project. I think that with the concessions that the community has, they have a real right, a real opportunity to shape the project and actually control the project in an unprecedented way. Well with that I'd ask the Committee to vote aye on this Land Use item 1031. And we can--unless there's some other comments? Council Member Barron?

COUNCIL MEMBER BARRON: I would just like to say that we have to watch the precedents that we're setting here. I'm voting for this school but I don't think any school should be given local zoning, not even 250, not 1, not 2, 'cause it doesn't happen in our communities.

I think if we have a policy issue, that's separate from a Land Use issue. And some of our children have to take a bus to a train to another bus to get to a high school. And that's why we have a Citywide zoning policy for high

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schools, so students who get a chance to go to these theme high schools, if you have a high school of performing arts in one community and you don't want other people from the other community coming to that, then that person can't get into performing arts. Or if it's a high school on electronics, Westinghouse and just the west in the Westinghouse community, you know, want just their children going to that school, then children from other Boroughs. And it breaks up the segregation of schools. It gets more into integrated,

13 diversity.

So I think that I'm voting for this school but even that which was given in, I think is setting a dangerous precedence because then when we go to other schools and they too want to make sure that some of their kids don't have to get on a train or a bus, then we're going to have problems down the road. There's a wise purpose for Citywide zoning of a high school so that every child in the City has an opportunity to go to any high school in the City. So I'm going to vote yes for this one but I'm concerned about the precedence we're setting here.

16	favor of this proposal but I will first thank
17	Council Member Crowley for her steadfast advocacy
18	for her community to do what's right for her
19	constituents. And there are a number of issues
20	that are not as clear, not as day and night as the
21	Department of Education would have us believe.
22	And some of the ugliness in the arguments has been
23	a product of the Department of Education's
24	divisive tactic here.
25	I would also say that once the

Department of Education gets the approval for this school that this school is not in itself sufficient to satisfy the needs of Queens, specifically northeast Queens and northern Queens in the high school grades. They will still be thousands of seats short.

And in the siting process, they
have not taken the most optimal sites in the
creation of these school seats. My worst fear is
that once they proceed with this high school, that
that will be in some ways the short term
alleviation of their responsibility.

We cannot allow that to happen. I will do everything I can to keep the pressure on the Department of Education to create the high school seats necessary, specifically in northern Queens because according to their own testimony, 8 high schools are severely overcrowded, over 150% at capacity. And so let's keep the pressure on the Department of Education. They have to do the right thing. They can't just keep coming up with these half-baked plans. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON COMRIE: I want to remind everyone. I have a head cold and I'm
