CHAIRPERSON DROMM: Okay. [gavel] good morning and welcome to today's Finance Committee meeting. My name is Council Member Daniel Dromm, and I'm the Chair of the Committee. We are joined by Council Member Jimmy Van Bramer, Council Member Robert Cornegy, Council Member Andy Cohen, Council Member Adrienne Adams, Council Member Keith Powers, Council Member Steve Matteo and Council Member Barry Grodenchik. Today, the Committee will be voting on three items: One Transparency Resolution, one Article XI Property Tax Exemption and one BID-one BID resolution. We have the Transparent-first we have the Transparency Resolution, which sets forth a new designation and changes in the designation of certain organizations receiving local, aging and youth discretionary funding and funding pursuant to certain initiatives in the budget. Organizations appearing in that resolution that have not yet completed the prequalification process conducted by the Mayor's Office of Contract Services, the Council or any-and another-or another entity are identified in the attached charts with an asterisk. As-as with all transparency resolutions, Council Members will have

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to sign a disclosure form indicating whether or not a conflict exists with any of the groups on the 3 attached list. If any Council Member has a potential conflict of interest with any of the organizations 6 listed, he or she has the opportunity to disclose the 7 conflict at the time of their vote. As a reminder, please disclose any conflicts you may have with 8 proposed subcontractors used by organizations 9 sponsored by discretionary funding. 10 disclosures must be made before the subcontractor can 11 12 be approved. Benjamin Smith from the General 13 Counsel's Office is here, and can assist you with any questions or concerns regarding disclosures. 14 15 we have a land use item, which is 645 Baretto Street 16 in Council Member Salamanca's District in the Bronx. 17 This action would provide a full 40-year Article XI 18 property tax exemption to support the preservation of 48 units of affordable co-op housing. Council Member 19 20 Salamanca is supportive of this exemption. we have the BID item, Resolution No. 564 sets forth 21 2.2 November 14, 2018 at 10:00 a.m. in this room to hold 23 a public hearing considering the Local Law that would authorize an increase in the budgets of 14 existing 24 BIDs throughout the city to increase the amounts they 25

2 expend annually. The budget increases have been requested by the property owners within the 3 boundaries of each BID, and will be used to enhance 4 the services provided. The 14 BIDs that are seeking 5 budget increases are: The Steinway Street BID in 6 7 Council Member Constantinides' and Council Member Van Bramer's district; the Graham Avenue BID in Council 8 Member Levin's and Council Member Reynoso's 9 districts: the Lower East Side BID in Council Member 10 Chin's district; the Fashion Center BID in the 11 Speaker's district; the Grand Street BID in Council 12 Member Reynoso's district; 125th Street BID in 13 Council Member Perkins' district; the Lincoln square 14 15 BID in the Speaker and Council Member Rosenthal's districts; the Madison/23rd/Flatiron/Chelsea BID in 16 17 the Speaker and Council Member Powers' and Council Member Rivera's districts; the Queens Plaza/Court 18 Square BID sometimes refereed to as the Long Island 19 20 City BID in Council Member Van Bramer's District; the Ridge-the Bay Ridge 5th Avenue BID in Council Member 21 Brannan's district; the Court-Livingston-Schermerhorn 2.2 23 BID in Council Member Levin's district; the Park Slope Fifth Avenue BID in Council Member Lander and 24 Council Member Menchaca's District; the Chinatown BID 25
