13	Use call-ups were adopted by a vote of 45 in the
14	affirmative and zero negative. Communication from
15	the Speaker.
16	SPEAKER QUINN: Thank you. We're
17	voting today on Intro 516-A, a piece of
18	legislation introduced by Council Member Peter
19	Vallone, the Chair of our Public Safety Committee.
20	I want to thank Rose Previte, who worked on this
21	bill, Oona Peterson and Alix Pustilnik and Rob
22	Neuman [phonetic], all who worked on this piece of
23	legislation.

This bill will require that the police department expand the documentation and the

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reporting that they conduct as it relates to
firearms discharge in the City of New York.
Through the work and communications of our Public
Safety Committee, we came to understand that
presently the police department does keep data
whenever a member of the service discharges their
weapons.

But, that data, quite frankly, up until today, has not been sufficient. In fact, the data that the department kept when a dog was shot in the City of New York was more detailed than when a human being was shot or shot at. For example, presently before this law, when a dog was shot or shot at, you would have to keep information about the breed of the dog and other information about the dog. You could easily go online and see of the thirty dogs that were shot last year, what type of dogs they were.

CHAIRPERSON GOTBAUM: Quiet,

please.

SPEAKER QUINN: No similar data regarding the age, the race or the gender of human beings who were shot or shot at by police officers was kept by the police department.

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Now, we are very lucky to be protected on a daily basis by the best police

4 department in the country, if not in the world.

5 We are also very lucky that that police department

6 has seen the number of times that they have

7 discharged their weapons in the last decade

8 decrease significantly. But, even so, we still

9 have an obligation as the entity that is charged

10 with oversight of the police department to find

11 ways that they can do their job even better.

And, this law will make sure that we, as the Council, receive data on a yearly basis, precinct by precinct, of discharge of firearms, borough by borough; data about the race, gender and age of those who have been shot at or shot. Looking at that data, working with our oversight functions with the police department will help us improve the work of the police department even further and hopefully, even further decrease the time that firearms are discharged in our City because, obviously, we only want that to occur when it absolutely has to.

In addition to the staff of the Council that I thanked, I want to thank

Chairperson Vallone for his vigorous oversight of the police department and his vigorous review of the reporting that led to this piece of legislation. I also want to thank the staff in the police department, particularly Sue Patino [phonetic], who worked very, very long and hard with us on this bill and the staff of the Mayor's Office of Legislative Affairs. I think it speaks volumes about when the Council and the Mayor and the police department can expand yearly public reporting of firearms discharge and do it together in a non-adversarial manner. And, I want to thank all of us, everyone who has worked on this legislation.

Let me call on the Chair of our Committee, Peter Vallone, who really helped focus us on this need and get us to the point of passing this law today.

COUNCIL MEMBER VALLONE: Thank you.

Charles Barron just congratulated me. So now, I

have to rethink my support for my own bill. He's

rethinking his support, too? But, no, it is a

very good bill. It continues in our City Council

tradition of requesting and demanding information

from the police department be made public and getting that done. We put crime in parks. We put that information out there. Crime in schools, we got that information out there. And now, we'll get information regarding every incident when a police officer discharges their weapon. An informed public is a safe public. This will allow us, as a Council, to do oversight as we are mandated to do. And, I congratulate my staff, especially Rose Nuna [phonetic] and everyone involved in this. Thank you, Madam Speaker.

It is important that this 14 legislation be passed and we're urging the 15 Governor to sign the Senate Bill 8575 and 11672, 16 which would authorize all of the public 17 subdivisions to deal with minority and women-owned 18 contractors. As this state is going to be the 19 recipient of dollars that will help to stimulate 2.0 this economy, one of the ways that can be helpful 21 in terms of dealing with a 50% minority 22 unemployment rate in this City is by allowing 2.3 minority businesses to be a part of the 24 contracting of businesses and services that this 25 City will be able to reap and allow the

participation of those who are unemployed.

So, I would urge my colleagues the importance of this because federal legislation is already in effect. But, it's important that we look and deal with and urging the Governor to sign this bill that would allow minority and womenowned participation. Thank you very much.

CHAIRPERSON GOTBAUM: Council Member Mealy.

COUNCIL MEMBER MEALY: I rise again to thank the Speaker, again, and your whole staff during my absence. And, I want to ask all my colleagues to sign on to a local law to amend the Administrative Code of New York in relation to street cleaning and collection of removal of recyclable material and refuse at street events.

As a community organizer, I, myself, was a black-- President of a non-black association. And, when we have our big events, a lot of recyclable things are left. And, we are asking now that even though all black association at special events do clean up behind them. But, all of them do not. 17	due to be closed on January 17 th . That Ladder
18	Company responded in one minute. The next nearest
19	Ladder Company, by the Fire Department's own
20	admission, will take ten minutes. We are talking
21	about people, their health and their actual life.
22	I hope that this Administration
23	reconsiders its position. We know there is a
24	fiscal crisis. But, the fiscal crisis cannot be a

reason to close a needed facility like a Ladder

company. This was a wood frame structure. It
went up at four in the morning. Ten minutes is
the minimal time an off-Island company will take
to get to City Island. With traffic and other
conditions, such as the drawbridges that lead to
City Island being up, we could be talking 20
minutes response time for a Ladder Company. Well,
I'm sorry, that's not good for the City that I
live in. And, we realize that City Island is not
just a residential facility, but it is a tourist
attraction for hundreds of thousands of people
every summer. This cut is ill-advised and this
cut can result in loss of life. There is still
time. I thank the delegation and the Borough for
sticking together on this item because we all know
the importance of this issue. And, I hope that
sense prevails in the days ahead. Thank you.

So, I encourage my colleagues to This is sending a message, in some ways sign on. more important than the summons itself, but it's a message to agents and to the City that tickets are to be given to encourage compliance and not to be used as a tool to harass homeowners in the City. companies and other fire companies in different

know it's absolutely crazy to leave that Island

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without the companies which protect it. And, that is not just a Bronx issue. But, all of us throughout the City must support retention of fire services.

My colleagues, it is also crazy to eliminate one of the Ladders companies from a 12-hours— to eliminate a 12-hour shift of one of the Ladder companies that responded on 9/11 to Ground Zero and which is currently designated to serve the Wall Street and Lower Manhattan areas, which include some of our City's most vulnerable security targets and in an area which is undergoing massive construction, which will make it impossible for the other fire companies to arrive at a call without undue delay.

It is also crazy to eliminate, in its entirety as proposed, fire protection from Governor's Island, just at the time when we are undertaking building demolition and reconstruction and the expansion of visitation on Governor's Island. We must not play Russian Roulette with the fire safety of New Yorkers in any part of the City. We must join together and work with the Chair of our Fire Committee--
