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afternoon, everybody. Welcome to the Subcommittee on Planning, Dispositions & Concessions. It's a Subcommittee of Land Use of the New York City

Council. My name is Dan Garodnick. And, I have the privilege of Chairing the Subcommittee. And, I'm joined today by my colleagues, Council Member Sara Gonzalez, Council Member Vinnie Ignizio,

Council Member Inez Dickens, all of this

Committee. And, we're also joined, in a special guest appearance, by Council Member Domenic M.

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Recchia, Jr. of Brooklyn.

We have one item on today's agenda

that we will be hearing. And, it is the related items of Land Use 1066 and 1067, Coney Island Commons, Brooklyn Community Board 13, C090250ZMK and C090251HAK. We have representatives from the City's Department of Housing, Preservation and Development. And, we're delighted they're here. And, we'll ask them to introduce these items jointly. Thank you.

CAROL CLARK: Good afternoon,
Chairman Garodnick and members of the Committee
and Council Member Recchia. My name is Carol

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I'm Assistant Commissioner at HPD. Clark. joined by Wendall Walter, who is the Assistant Commissioner for Housing Production at HPD. And, he will give the testimony on LU 1067, also known as the Coney Island Commons project.

WENDALL WALTERS: Yes, good afternoon. Wendall Walters introducing -- after all this time -- introducing Land Use Number 1067, also known as Coney Island Commons, consists of the proposed disposition of 36 vacant City-owned lots located at West 29th and West 30th Streets between Mermaid and Surf Avenues in Coney Island, Brooklyn.

The proposed development team of ELH and the Kretchmer [phonetic] Companies will construct two residential buildings, providing 187 residential units, plus one super's unit. In addition, the project will include an approximately 41,200 square foot YMCA, with 28,888 square feet of open space and 106 parking spaces.

The project was the subject of an RFP issued jointly by HPD and EDC. And, the targeted affordability for this rental project will be up to 100% of AMI, which we anticipate

ANTHONY WILLIAMSON: First of all, good afternoon. My name is Anthony Williamson.

And, I'm actually the co-Chair of Coney Island

CLEAR, which is Community Labor Empowerment

Alliance for Redevelopment. And, first of all, I

must thank the developer for coming into Coney

Island and, you know, having the courage to come

and develop and, you know, make a change in Coney

Island. And, I want to thank the Councilman

Recchia and his team for really working hard to

make sure project be a success.

But, as a member of organized labor, our concern is always how the work is done and ensuring that people get, you know, decent wages that they can take care of their families in this grave economic times. And, I will more or less echo the same sentiments of the Councilman

and we hope that in future redevelopment, that the construction trades and the building trades are part of this whole process. It's very, very

important in this grave economic time.

So, I would like to, more or less, ask that from here moving forward that there is some commitment and I guess people are working, but, there should be on the record that there's some commitment that organized labor and union trades will be part of this significant project in Coney Island, because there are many people there who want this opportunity. Many people, kids there who want the opportunity to be part of this whole redevelopment. They want the kids to be trained. We have apprenticeship training and all the different opportunities that are available.

So, I want to thank everybody for giving me the opportunity to speak. But, just reminding developers and all those concerned that union labor and organized labor should not be consider as a problem, but as part of the solution of Coney Island. Thank you.
