plume of harmful smoke when entering or exiting the facility. Permitting smoking on the grounds of these facilities send the wrong public health message. Additionally similar versions of this legislation have already been enacted throughout our country by numerous states and localities including the states of Arkansas, Colorado, Idaho, Washington and cities such as Duluth, Minnesota, Sioux City? Sioux City, okay. Iowa. Buffalo in New York. The cost of smoking is grave and bystanders should not be subjected to unwanted second-hand smoke as they are entering or exiting hospitals of all places.

A study by the City Department of
Health and Mental Hygiene revealed more than 2.5
million non-smoking adults in New York City have
been exposed to such a level of second-hand smoke
that measurable residue can be found in their
bodies. Clearly this legislation further protects
innocent bystanders. I would like to thank the
staff of the Committee for their hard work. And
before we begin, let me introduce my colleagues
who are here with us. We have Council Member
Mathieu Eugene. We have Council Member Mitchell--

sorry about that. We have Council Member Helen
Sears, Councilwoman Maria del Carmen Arroyo and
Council Member Inez Dickens. And at this point in
time, let me introduce my colleague who sponsored
the piece of legislation, Inez, Dickens, who will
make a statement about this particular piece of
legislation.

Thank you Majority Leader Rivera for allowing me to make brief remarks in support of Intro 642-A which bans smoking around entrances to hospitals. When people are on their way to treatments, appointments, visits or other business in New York City hospitals, they must not be forced to walk through a cloud of smoke to get into the buildings. This does not promote good heath or wellness. This ban is a common sense measure that will prevent bad habits from impacting on the health of those who are entering a hospital to improve their own well being.

You wouldn't hold an Alcoholics

Anonymous meeting in the back room of a bar. In
the same way, people on their way to a smoking
cessation program or any other medical appointment

2	should be in a smoke-free environment. It's just
3	common sense. I want to thank the staff who
4	helped me and worked on this piece of legislation,
5	Adira Siman, the Committee's Counsel, Joel Mancino
