3 Welcome to today's hearing of the City Council's 4 Committee on Transportation. My name is John Liu. I have the privilege of chairing this committee. 5 6 We've convened for the purposes of hopefully 7 passing Intro 871-A. This is a piece of 8 legislation designed to ease bicycle access into office buildings, specifically commercial office 9 10 buildings that have freight elevators. We'll see 11 you in a second, Councilman Seabrook. This is a 12 bill that was last heard in the Transportation 13 Committee on June 15th. This is a bill that has 14 been worked on by the prime sponsor Councilman 15 Yassky, the Department of Transportation, the 16 Department of Buildings and numerous advocates for 17 a lengthy period of time. It has been adapted 18 substantially. At the last hearing on June 15th, 19 I had voiced some specific concerns about the fact 20 that the bill no longer allowed the department to 21 deny exemptions to building owners who claimed 22 that they should be exempt from the requirements 23 of this bill. The teeth have been added back into 24 the bill. The other deficiency I had laid out on 25 June 15th was that for the very first time,

inexplicably, the Department of Transportation was
being charged with inspecting the inside of a
building when in fact it had plenty of work to do
on sidewalks and streets. That has also been
corrected so that the jurisdiction for enforcing
the building interior provisions of this bill now
rests once again with the Department of Buildings.
And with that, colleagues, I believe that this
bill sponsored by Council Member Yassky is
substantive and is ready for a vote. I turn the
floor to the prime sponsor, Councilman Yassky.

COUNCIL MEMBER YASSKY: Thank you,
Chairman. I don't want to take the committee's
time. I just want to thank you and commend you for
your work on this bill. The bill is improved
significantly from the original version. As you
point out, the freight elevator thing was more in
the nature of a compromise to get it done. But
the improvements that you have made are real and
genuine. I just want to thank you for that. I
thank you very much for pushing it forward. I
think it's a terrific bill.
