2 CHAIRPERSON AVELLA: Good morning, 3 everyone. As chair of this committee, I do 4 apologize for keeping everybody waiting. I know 5 this room was full at 9:30. The obvious item we 6 have on the agenda today is the Coney Island 7 project. There has been a lot of discussion going 8 on back and forth while you've been sitting here. That discussion is apparently going to continue. 9 10 We are going to recess this meeting until tomorrow 11 at 10:30. What I'd like to do is recognize, first 12 of all, the committee members that are here: 13 Council Members Simcha Felder, Eric Gioia, Helen 14 Sears, Melinda Katz, Larry Seabrook and Robert 15 Jackson and we are also joined by some members of 16 the Land Use Committee which will meet immediately 17 after my committee recesses. Of course, we've 18 been joined all morning by Council Member Domenic 19 Recchia. I'm going to call on Council Member 20 Melinda Katz in a second but I know she's probably 21 going to say what I'm going to say. I find it an 22 absolute disgrace that the Administration waits 23 until the last minute and waits until the weekend 24 and this morning to start working out a lot of the

details that need to be worked out on this

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application. This is a huge project and really will determine the future of Coney Island for a long time to come. I compliment Council Member Domenic Recchia for the numerous meetings and discussions he's had. But you know something, it has to be an equal partnership, and we cannot have the Administration waiting until the last minute to do what we think is right, not only on this application but on others. I put the blame clearly on the Administration that we're having these last minute discussions. I know Domenic Recchia and I know the members of this committee and the Land Use Committee want to make sure that the project that comes out at the end is the best possible project. With that, I'd like to call on Council Member Katz and then Council Member Jackson.

council Member Katz: Good morning, everyone. First of all, I'd like to apologize to the members of both the subcommittee and the Land Use Committee for holding everything up today. As you know, and we always talk about this, that many times in our committee we work out agreements for the Council Member but also for the benefit of the

2 whole city. That does take a lot of time and 3 forces us to stay here while we await those agreements. I will say, however, that in this 5 particular circumstance there is no reason we need 6 to be sitting here today. It is amazing to me in 7 the seven years that I have been chair of the Land 8 Use Committee that I have not seen a project that 9 was so important to the future of the city, so 10 important to the jobs that it will create in this 11 city, so important to the housing it will create 12 in this city, that has caused such controversy at 13 the last minute and it seems like when you look around the room and you look at who the phone 14 15 calls are from and everyone that is talking out 16 there that it's a plan that's such a great thing 17 for the city that no one's happy with. It is 18 amazing to me that we're here today doing this. 19 We need to reach an agreement. The Administration 20 needs to come to the table. We know that they are 21 working on it, but it's a little late. We've kept 22 everyone waiting for several hours already. 23 want to commend also Councilman Recchia. He has 24 spent the last few months trying to get good 25 agreements for everyone involved in this.

15 Jackson.

Mr. Chair, and good morning, everyone. I'm going to try to be as patient as possible because I do know that agreements of this magnitude sometimes take a long time. I can appreciate the intense negotiations that take place because I was involved in similar situations previously where members of the various zoning committees and land use committees were waiting until agreements had

been reached. But I say to my colleagues that

worked in his district. He has worked with the Administration. He has worked with every single community group, every single union and all the folks that are out there and still today, at the last day, we are having this discussion. So this is an important project for the city. We need to all get to the table. We need to figure it out. We need to make agreements that are better for the city as we move forward. So I want to thank you Councilman Avella, as I think you'll probably announce, we're going to postpone it until tomorrow, but you'll announce that. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON AVELLA: Council Member

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while this is important, this is not the only thing in our lives. As a member of the City Council, I represent 163,000 people in northern Manhattan. This Zoning Subcommittee and Land Use was scheduled I think last Thursday or Friday, something like that. It was postponed until today. I'm here. Now it's going to be postponed I don't know if I'm going to be here again. tomorrow. I have other commitments that are just as important that affect the constituents that I represent. Now while I appreciate that this is huge for the city and may be bring in hundreds of millions or billions of dollars in years to come, and I can appreciate that, but life does not revolve around Coney Island for me. Let me just be quite frank and honest. So I wish that the City Administration and all other parties get together and hammer it out immediately. Like the deadline is like 12:00 today. So that when we come back together that we will be ready to move forward. Quite frankly, as a member of the Zoning Subcommittee, as a member of the Land Use Committee and as a member of the City Council that must vote on this whenever we vote in full Stated

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2 Meeting, I am not ready to vote because I don't 3 know the particular details. Let me just say to all of you, I am not going to be a rubber stamp for anyone. Until I'm aware of all of the 5 6 particular details that are surrounding this 7 particular matter, until I am satisfied that the best has been done overall and I understand that the ideal situation is that we reach a consensus. 9 And where consensus cannot be reached, then we 11 have to just make a decision. I know that. I say 12 to all of you, and some of you were here when we 13 had the full day hearing that lasted until the 14 evening, I sat through almost every minute of that 15 Coney Island hearing until the end, absent of me 16 going out to the bathroom or going to get some 17 lunch. So I listened to all of the parties. So 18 now I'm asking you to listen to me. Get your act 19 together and come forward with a plan that we all 20 can agree. That's what's important to me as a 21 member of this Zoning Committee, of the Land Use 22 Committee and as a member of the City Council. 23 Thank you, Mr. Chair.

> CHAIRPERSON AVELLA: Thank you. have two other Council Members that want to speak.

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I would just say for the record to remind 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9

everybody why we have to meet tomorrow and that is because the City Planning Commission will be meeting on Wednesday and if we are to modify this application we must get it to them so that they can get it back to us so that we can vote on it on the full Stated Meeting on the 29th. Otherwise, unless we have a special meeting of the City Council, we will lose the opportunity to comment, period, on the application. We'll have Council

> COUNCIL MEMBER FELDER: Thank you very much, Mr. Chairman. I just wanted to say that this issue is not new, this has been going on for a very, very long time and the Administration cannot hold us hostage. During last week's hearing, a number of us asked the Administration to request a postponement so that there would be enough time to work out a variety of issues. took more than a year for their representative to finally almost like vomit out that they'll do eminent domain if they have to. That was after a number of my colleagues forced them to say so.

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There were a lot of other issues such as labor issues. There are a lot of issues. But it's not something that just popped up today; it's something that's been going on for a very, very long time. Although Coney Island, I would say especially to some of us who live nearby, is something that's not necessarily only something in the district, it's something that's important to all of us. The reason that I and many of our colleagues feel so strongly about deferring to Councilman Recchia is because of all the hours and the time and the heart and soul that he's put into They are not going to take advantage of him and they're not going to take advantage of the people in this city by trying to push something to the last minute and then sort of say if you don't say yes, we're cutting off the oxygen. That's not going to happen.

CHAIRPERSON AVELLA: Council Member Recchia, I ask for your cooperation. I'd like to call on Helen Sears first.

COUNCIL MEMBER SEARS: Thank you,

Mr. Chair, and I'll be very, very brief. First, I

really want to thank Councilman Recchia because I

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know the effort that he has put in to really and truly having an amicable agreement with the city, the committee and the City Council. I really want to thank you because I think you put everything in perspective. As it relates to today, the fact is, and as Councilwoman Melinda said, this is probably one of the most important things that we have to do. As a member of the Zoning and Franchise, to think that we would be able to do this and vote yes on one of the most major things for the City of New York is pretty ludicrous. I'm looking that community board in 3/16/09 approved with conditions. The borough president at 4/27/09approved with conditions. The CBC did it on 6/17. I have no idea, we haven't discussed those conditions, whether they will be met. I have no The fact of the matter is we come here and idea. there is more confusion, disarray and disagreement. There is no way that we could do that and I really apologize to everybody that we have kept you that long because we are the ones that have been in the meetings and dealing with the disagreement. I will be here tomorrow because I know the urgency of this. It's not that we like

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to do that because we all have a schedule that takes us into midnight. But it is essential. I think it also shows that we don't take our work lightly when it comes to zoning and land use or any other issue that comes before the committees that we are on. I think that Administration and everyone in the room needs to recognize that we are not rubber stamps. We respect our colleague. We respect the work he's done and he's trying to bring us all together. The fact of the matter is we still have a vote that makes a big difference whether this project goes ahead or it doesn't go ahead. That is the key thing. So thank you for recessing it, because hopefully we have a lot cleared up. What is important is that there is unity with the committee and that there is agreement with all parties. I know that Councilman Recchia will do his best to do that. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON AVELLA: Council Member Barron has a comment.

COUNCIL MEMBER BARRON: Yes, I just wanted to encourage us, as I do on a lot of our issues, to make sure that while some colleagues

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vote with colleagues and not with colleagues, it's about the people of that particular district. It's about jobs in that district. It's about affordable housing in that district. We've got to keep that foremost in mind. And it's probably a more political statement and I'll get in trouble for saying, but what the heck, I stay in there Those unions and others who rubber stamp and endorse the mayor before we even get him to do the right thing by the people of the city, you need to think twice about that because now we've got to come here and try to beat up on the mayor and beat up on City Planning while others endorse him before you even get everything that you're supposed to get out of the mayor. It's about the people of this city. It's not about Domenic Recchia. It's not about Mayor Bloomberg. It's about the people of this city. So don't come in flipping papers at us and everything and now you want us to rumble after you all endorsed the mayor who is harmful to us in this city. Black unemployment is at 14%, 15%, 16%, the gap between the rich and the poor is widening. Here we're sitting here on a singular issue and you're saying

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don't shrink Coney Island; fix it and all of that stuff. That's fine. Then you all be as bold outside as we are inside so that that way we know it's about the people and not just about your personal interests when it comes to dealing with issues like this. I'm not in favor of projects that have less than 40% or 50% affordable housing for our people that don't get prevailing wages. But you shouldn't be satisfied with a mayor that does that either because that is true unity looking after the people and not just your personal interests when it comes around a particular issue. So we are looking at close to 50% of our people in our districts not in the workforce. The 13% or 14% unemployment isn't even real. That's for those who are receiving benefits. Nearly 50% of black men are unemployed and 30-40% of Latinos are unemployed or not in the workforce. So if we're going to deal real around these issues and want the City Council members to support you, then you do the same thing outside of these meetings. Do the same thing and be progressive when it comes to standing up to a mayor who has really been against the working
