## CHAIRPERSON AVELLA: Good

3	afternoon, everyone, and it is the afternoon. I'c
4	like to call this meeting of the Subcommittee on
5	Zoning and Franchises to order. First, let me
6	mention the committee members. Joining me are
7	Council Members Melinda Katz, Robert Jackson,
8	Helen Sears Simcha Felder and Eric Gioia. We're
9	also joined by members of the Land Use Committee
10	which will meet immediate thereafter. Before I
11	get into the business of the morning, I would just
12	like to recognize Jason Davis and the CUNY
13	Language Immersion program from the Bronx
14	Community College of CUNY. Stand up. This is an
15	ESL program and many of the participants are from
16	the Dominican Republic and Mexico. Welcome. You
17	get a firsthand about how government works this
18	morning. Hurry up and wait. I do apologize to
19	everybody that's been here since 10:30. This is
20	obviously a very important issue and project for
21	the City of New York and there has been a lot of
22	discussion going on back and forth. Council
23	Member Katz, who is chair of the Land Use
24	Committee, and I have had a discussion and what
25	we'd like to do, Council Members, is whatever

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discussion there is to have on the motion we would have at the subcommittee so that we don't have two rounds of discussion, considering that we've already been waiting for this committee meetings for several hours. I'm not going to make an opening statement. I will make my comments a little bit later. I'd like to call on Council Member Domenic Recchia for an opening statement.

COUNCIL MEMBER RECCHIA: Council Member Tony Avella. I want to thank you and Melinda Katz for all that you have done for not only myself but for the constituents and to all my colleagues, thank you for coming yesterday and for coming back today. I know some of you had to come back from your summer vacations, so I want to thank you. I want to thank the Administration for working with me and for working from the best interests of not only my community but for the people of New York City. I'd like to make some remarks about this project before I ask for your support for this redevelopment of Coney Island. First, I'd like to talk about the current Coney Island. It's a Coney Island with only limited rides and amusement, where the local community

2 struggles with a variety of problems, including a 3 lack of good government opportunities, a lack of necessary infrastructure and poor educational facilities. This project is an opportunity to 5 6 gain needed amenities for the over 50,000 people 7 who call Coney Island home, as well as improve the 8 amusement and entertainment areas for the millions 9 who visit Coney Island every year. I started this 10 project seven years ago because I could see that 11 Coney Island was in trouble. I spoke with all of 12 the operators and put together a plan which 13 resulted in the formation of the Coney Island Development Corporation and the redevelopment plan 14 15 which then was put forward. I wanted to make sure 16 that those who had stayed in the community and 17 helped it to prosper were respected in any plan 18 that went forward. I'm happy to report that the 19 Wonder Wheel and its owners are supportive of the 20 project and look forward to being a part of the 21 revitalization of Coney Island. The owners of 22 Gargiulo's have also had input into the 23 redevelopment and are pleased about their 24 continued future in Coney Island. I've had many 25 discussions with all of the stakeholders in Coney

2 Island and listened to all opinions, including at 3 hours of public hearings hosted both here in the Council Chambers and in Coney Island. I would like to have been able to expand the area 5 6 available for open amusements and I have been 7 actively discussing this with the Administration. 8 Those discussions have been fruitful and are ongoing. I hope that by the time the Council 9 10 votes on this I will have great news for everyone, 11 but I am confident that this project as it 12 currently stands is good for the city, good for 13 Brooklyn and great for Coney Island. Similarly, I 14 know that there are those who would like to see 15 lower buildings on the south side of Surf Avenue. 16 We just couldn't make this work and I will be 17 moving forward with the project that you see 18 today. I recommend to my colleagues to approve 19 these applications as modified with respect to 20 Wonder Wheel, Wonder Wheel Way and to see them go 21 forward to City Planning. The tradeoff has been 22 worth it. We're getting a first class amusement 23 park, the long awaited new gym for P.S. 188, 24 infrastructure to improve the bad drainage and 25 sewer problems that have plaqued the peninsula, a

2 new skating rink in Coney Island that will 3 continue to serve not only the community but the 4 hockey league and local residents, affordable 5 housing opportunities including exciting home 6 ownership opportunities with fund to assist the 7 constituents of Coney Island with down payments 8 and funds for the renovation of the Boardwalk and Drier-Offerman Park. The Administration has made 9 10 commitments to encourage local hiring, to provide 11 training for local residents in the food services, 12 hospitality and other areas and working to see 13 that the high rate of unemployment in Coney Island comes down and the Administration is committed to 14 15 working with me to address this issue. With all 16 of these new visitors coming to Coney Island, it 17 is important that we have a first class trauma and 18 emergency room in Coney Island Hospital to handle 19 these emergencies. I can now tell you that the 20 Administration is committing to upgrading the 21 modernization of Coney Island Hospital and to 22 handle the capacities of the current and future 23 residents and visitors. It's impossible to make 24 everyone 100% happy. This accomplishes the goal 25 of making everyone happy enough that we can move

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2 forward to a revitalized Coney Island. I 3 5 6 7

recommend to my colleagues that they approve these applications as modified with respect to Wonder Wheel, Wonder Wheel Way and send them to City Planning. By doing so, we will take the first step to restoring the glamour, the glory and the greatness of the World's Greatest Playground Coney

CHAIRPERSON AVELLA: Thank you, Council Member. Now I'd like to call upon Council Member Melinda Katz to make the actual motion.

Island. Please vote aye.

COUNCIL MEMBER KATZ: Good afternoon my colleagues, good afternoon everyone that was extremely patient in seeing this through today. Before I make the actual motion, let me just say that as chair of the Land Use Committee and I'm sure that the chair of the subcommittee, Tony Avella, would agree that this has been, whether you vote yes or no, one of the largest collaborations that we have had over the last seven years. I want to congratulate Council Member Recchia for all the work that he did in his community. This was not an easy project to pull together. And at the end of the day, although

2 everyone is not 100% happy, I believe that there 3 is a sufficient way for almost everyone to have something that we need for Coney Island to go forward. This is a project that is needed. This 5 6 is a project the community has been waiting for. 7 It is a project the Administration has been 8 working on as well as us for years. At the end of 9 the day, we will create jobs, we will create 10 affordable housing, and we will create an 11 amusement area that New York City can continue to 12 be proud of for the next few generations. So I'm 13 proud to be a part of it. My motion here is to pass the rezoning proposal with one modification. 14 15 But as it I, this rezoning proposal will result in 16 the creation of a new 27-acre amusement district, 17 open and enclosed uses, over 6,000 permanent jobs 18 and over 25,000 construction jobs, the creation of 19 MWBE and Workforce Development programs, over 20 4,500 new housing units, 30% at least will be 21 affordable and new home ownership programs, the 22 creation of 500,000 square feet of new retail and 23 services to serve Coney Island, the creation of at 24 least 900 new hotel rooms, \$14 billion of new 25 economic activity in Coney Island over the next 30

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2 years and the plan is committed to a significant 3 infrastructure in terms of new parkland sewer and 5 6

drainage systems for the area. Those of you from Coney Island know you sorely need that. I make a motion that this be approved with one modification. The modification is to remove the Wonder Wheel site from the mapping action and make the related amendments to the zoning text for

10 that. I have an official document, Mr. Chair, on 11 the modifications to be handed in.

> CHAIRPERSON AVELLA: Thank you. Αt this point, I'd like to make a friendly amendment to the motion. After I make the motion, we will vote on the amendment and then we will vote on the full proposal. The amendment that I'm making is in two parts. First, before I mention the amendment, let me just say that I also concur with Council Member Katz's analysis of how much that Council Member Recchia has done in this process. It is clear that he has really gone beyond what is expected of a normal Council Member to work out a lot of the details and make sure that this project is better than it was proposed by the Administration. There are a lot of great things

in it. The amendments that I'm going to submit for a vote have to do really with the high rises south of Surf Avenue and the expansion of the amusement area. They do not affect the great benefits that Council Member Recchia has worked out. The first part of the amendment is eliminate the high rise towers proposed for the south side of Surf Avenue east of KeySpan Park, amend the zoning to keep the south side of Surf Avenue low rise, below 25 feet. The second part is to expand the proposed amusement area so that it extends from the Boardwalk to the Bowery and Coney East. With that, I will ask counsel to call the vote on the amendment.

COUNCIL MEMBER KATZ: I think that was a motion for a friendly amendment. As the Council Member who made the motion, I will say no to the friendly amendment and ask my colleagues to please vote no on this amendment. After discussion with Council Member Recchia, I ask for a no vote on the amendments for these reasons.

Number one, I would love to be able to expand the area available for open amusements and we've been in active discussions with the Administration on

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These discussions have been fruitful. They are ongoing and I hope that by the time the Council votes on this we might have great news for everyone. But as it stands, I ask for a no vote on the requirement that in this application it's expanded. Similarly, I know that there are those that would like to see a lower building size on Surf Avenue. This has been discussed. We have negotiated this out. We have had discussions with the Administration. But at the end of the day, the hotels are there really to offset the fact that the amusement park is not a year-round income producing area for this area of Coney Island. we think that it is better that it goes forward as it stands. So I recommend to my colleagues the no vote on the amendment. I guess you'd have to call for a vote.

CHAIRPERSON AVELLA: Unless anybody else wants to have a discussion on the amendment.

Council Member Jackson has a comment.

COUNCIL MEMBER JACKSON: Thank you,
Mr. Chair. On the amendment, while I can
appreciate the amendment, knowing that the
discussions on this particular matter have been

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ongoing for such a long time that I find the amendment at this point in time a little bit too late in the process in respects to the vote that's taking place now. I had the opportunity, as you know, while waiting to listen to some of the people saying to expand the amusement area and to reduce the towers. But I say that in the whole context of all things considered, as you know Tony, Domenic has been involved in this for years. I've asked the people where it says "don't shrink Coney Island but fix it" whether or not they have had discussions with all of the parties involved in order to put forward their vision of Coney Island and obviously they have to a certain extent that people were listening. I say that at this point in time, all things considered, if it doesn't meet Domenic's approval, then I have to say that I will be voting no on the amendment. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON AVELLA: Anybody else?

Before I ask for the vote on this, the only that I would respond to your comments, Council Member

Jackson, is that these issues have been brought up and they're still outstanding. So it's not like

And I say that because it is kind of infamous that we have had to do what we have had to do and labor being a very sticking point to do that. Who better but government to set an example of what we do for our labor force? That doesn't mean that we diminish the importance of the private sector. doesn't mean that we diminish the importance of a profit. But we have a moral obligation and I say this because before we vote, I'm really going to ask the Administration to continue their

Island with respect to affordable housing, health
care, jobs and other matters that are part of this
discussion that we've had here today. With that,
