I know that people may feel that they have done a lot of work and I commend my colleague for all of the work that he's done. But in these situations when we're talking about people who live in public housing and trying to get them into home ownership and doing the higher income bracket of that, and then those who are below \$60,000 and trying to get in and they may have to go into rentals. Then we're talking about four hotels that are 15 stories high and another building at 27 stories high. I think this needs far more thinking through. I think that more of the community needs

to be involved in these negotiations. So on that

I'm going to vote no. I think that sometimes when
we try to rush into things and try to get things
passed in the long run when this vote is over with
and it plays out in the communities, the results
often aren't what they looked like on paper. Then
when we get to the real life situation, we find
the results are far more, or less beneficial for
the people in the community and more beneficial
for developers who are trying to make super
profits and who want to make the community look
like a richer community and not a poor community
so we can put a more affluent look on the
community as opposed to really helping the people
in the community get some affordable housing and
have businesses that work. It's not really about
that. In my opinion it's about developers putting
a more affluent face on a community so they can
make better profits. For that I vote no.
