detailed plan for demolition, including when work

is to be done by mechanical devices. For example

jack hammers and bobcats.

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Proposed Intro 994 requires uniform color coding of a standpipe and sprinkler systems.

Proposed Intro 999-A would require that the site safety manager or a coordinator inspect the standpipe system daily to ensure that the system is available and to conduct weekly checks to verify that no breach exists in the system and to keep a log of the inspections.

Proposed Intro 1000-A would require that standpipes be painted red before they could be considered operational, allow capping of standpipes during the demolition work only when performed by a licensed Master Plumber or a licensed Fire Suppression Piping contractors who have obtained the permit by the New York City Fire Department and the Department of Buildings, to approve an application for the removal of damaged sprinkler systems.

Previously on June 8th this

Committee heard testimony from representatives of the Department of Buildings, from the Fire

Department, from real estate industry professionals with regard to the four pieces of legislation before the Committee. There were some

amendments since the June 8th hearing and they were noted in the Committee reports but I'll detail them very briefly.

Intro 993 now requires that the

Department of Buildings approve plans for

demolition prior to the issuance of a work permit

and to promulgate any necessary rules before the

effective date and that the Departments of Housing

and Preservation and Development and the

Department of Citywide Administrative Services are

now exempt from submitting such documents when

performing or arranging the performance of

emergency demolitions.

Intro 994 was amended to allow for the standpipe to be identified by a letter legend in accordance with ANSI national standards so long as it does not obscure the required labeling of the pipe.

An exception to the painting requirement was added where a different color coding may be required pursuant to the New York City Fire Code. The painting requirement of cross-connections and risers were changed to red and the handles of the valve serving these

sprinklers now must be painted green for new buildings, buildings undergoing an alteration and completed buildings as well as buildings under construction. However where a standpipe is used as a combination standpipe and sprinkler system, the vale handles must be painted yellow.

During these alterations the painting of the valves in the cases where a hydrostatic pressure test is required, must now be conducted prior to this test. The retroactive provision for completed buildings was amended to require that all exposed risers and crossconnections be painted within three months after the effective date of this bill which effectively gives them nine months to comply should the Mayor sign these bills.

A new requirement was added that a licensed Master Plumber, Master Fire Suppression Contractor, Registered Architect or Professional Engineer or the holder of an FDNY Certificate of Fitness for the operation and maintenance of a standpipe sprinkler system must certify that the painting has been indeed completed. The required certification must be kept on the premises and

2 made available for inspection by the Department of 3 Buildings and FDNY.

that a safety manager keep a record of the required inspections of standpipe systems in a log book. And finally Intro 1000 was amended to require that an existing house check valve to remain in place until the completion of the demolition work. I'd like to urge all my colleagues to vote in favor of these bills. And I'd like to call on one of the bill's sponsors, Council Member Vinnie Ignizio to make a brief statement on the personal effects on the changes in these bills. Council Member Ignizio.

Mr. Chairman. I want to thank you, this

Committee, particularly the Speaker and Deputy

Mayor Skyler for working very closely with the

Council. But really this bill is about

Firefighter Graffagnino and Fire Fighter Bedia.

This bill will save lives. And the final act of these heroic men who gave their lives for this

City will be the gift that no one will meet the same fate as they did in these tragic fires.
