Test, test, test. Today is the Committee on Transportation. Today's date is March 27, 2019.

This is recorded by Sacheem [phonetic] Bradley.

CHAIRPERSON RODRIGUEZ: Good afternoon and welcome to this hearing of the City Council Transportation Committee. My name is Ydanis Rodriguez, the Chair of this Committee. First, let me recognize my colleagues who are here with us. Council Member Diaz, Richards, Miller, Koo, Menchaca, Cabrera, Salamanca, Deutsch. Today we will be voting on the proposed Intro. 1010-A, a bill that is sponsored by Council Member Miller. Proposed Intro 1010-A would address the issue of commercial vehicles parking overnight on residential streets by creating an alternative means of enforcement adjudicated through all. The newly created fine would be higher than those in existing law \$400 for a first offense and \$800 for a second offense within a six month period. This new means of enforcement will help to deter tractor trailers and other large commercial vehicles from illegally parking overnight on residential streets. I would now like to invite the sponsor of the, to deliver the opening statement, Council Member Miller.

2	COUNCIL MEMBER MILLER: Thank you Chair
3	Rodriguez. Today this body will vote on the first
4	bill of my hour, Commercial Truck Abuse Act,
5	Introduction 1010. This bill would establish a
6	costly civil penalty for 18-wheel, big rigs overnight
7	in residential areas. The drivers of commercial
8	tractor trailers routinely abuse our City's parking
9	regulations and degrade the quality of life in
10	communities throughout the City. They park these
11	monstrosities next to homes, bus stops, fire
12	hydrants, schools, playground for hours, sometimes
13	even days on end leaving pollution, debris in their
14	wake. We have worked with NYPD to ramp up its
15	enforcement efforts but these efforts often and
16	offenses continued. The current fines imposed on big
17	rig drivers have not been effective in curbing the
18	abuse of practices either which they deemed the
19	course of doing business. In actuality the greatest
20	expense of the course of doing business is the health
21	and safety of our communities. Now we will send a
22	clear message to the bad actors of operating within
23	the trucking industry that the price for such
24	flagrant abuse is steep. Instead of \$250 for the
25	first fine or offense, \$500 for a fine for subsequent

fines, one occurring within six months period,
authorities will be able to issue a larger civil
penalty respect to amounts, \$400 and \$800 for the
second. I want to thank Speaker Johnson, Chair
Rodriguez for supporting this advancement of this
important measure. Also like to thank committee
counsel, James Dejavani [phonetic], Elliott Lynn for
their work with this augmenting bill as well as my
legislative director, Brandon Clark, Greg Rose, we
started this a year and a half ago and special
advisor, the great Joe Goldbloom [phonetic] for their
combined efforts over the past two years in bringing
this to fruition today. I'd like to thank the Chair
once again and my colleagues that sit around us.
This is something that has plagued all communities
throughout the City and look forward to voting on it
in the affirmative this afternoon.

CHAIRPERSON RODRIGUEZ: Thank you Council Member Miller for your statement and for all the work you have done to address this issue. I now call for the vote on Proposal Intro. 1010-A. I recommend a yes vote and I ask the committee clerk to please call the roll.

I've been struggling with this issue, literally right where I live, Sedgwick Avenue, Bailey Avenue, where these big Mac trucks they come and they take parking. They stay there overnight and I'm talking about every single day so you can I'm livid about people taking advantage, these truck drivers, of our communities who are not from our communities. They come in and the police department, they even go the extra mile making, calling them, calling the companies to do something about it. We do need more tow trucks. know the NYPD is here. Please, we only have one. Let's get a few more and if we could help with capital, we'll help with that as well so we can have

close proximity to the airports and close proximity

to air cargo at JFK and I know LaGuardia as well in
particular but when you look at where these trucks
park, you know, they are taking advantage of New York
City and especially communities that have high asthma
rates, where disparities around health and everything
else exist, we've seen these truck drivers taking a
consistent advantage of our neighborhood so this is a
great day. I do want to elaborate a little bit more
on where Council Member Cabrera mentioned more trucks
and I know that is a discussion we have had and I
know that's something we're gonna bring up once again
during Exec. budget hearings with the Commissioner
but I do believe we do have an agreement with PD that
we will gently remind them of purchasing more of
these truck, tow trucks, heavy duty tow trucks and
largely because a lot of our precincts don't have the
capacity. They want to do the right thing. They go
out there. They ticket. They're giving their all
but there's simply not enough heavy duty tow trucks
to really get rid of these monstrosities in our
neighborhoods so with that being said,
congratulations Council Member Miller and I vote aye.

In the south Bronx I represent two IBZs, business improvement district, industrial business improvement districts which is Hunts Point and Port Morris. In Hunts Point alone I have over 16,000 trucks daily that come in and out of my community because they're going into, you know, one of the 700 businesses that I have at Hunts Point and I do represent the produce market, the meat market, the fish market and other businesses there but Hunts Point is also, half of Hunts Point is residential and these trucks they do take advantage. They park overnight and they create, they do affect our quality of life and as much as we've relied on, at that local precinct, you know, the tickets that they get, it's just a course of doing business but increasing these fines will really make the driver or the business
