CHAIRPERSON LEVINE: Welcome everybody to the City Council's Committee on Health. I'm Mark Levine the Chair. I'm pleased that we are joined by two of our committee members, Council Member Keith Powers and Council Member Alicka Ampry-Samuel. you both for joining us. We are considering today a landmark package of bills to strengthen the city's inspection and oversight of water tanks. These are not cooling towers. That's been the subject of many other hearing. These are the iconic round oak structures on the roofs of many buildings that supply our drinking water. This is drinking water which is amongst the cleanest in the world, and I want to emphasize that there are no recorded cases of health events related to contaminated water tanks. Having said that, there has been some investigative reporting by city and state, which has revealed consistent problems of contamination of these structures with vermin and pigeons and other contaminants, and we want to make sure that New Yorkers understand our city is inspecting and managing and overseeing these structures so they do not fear to drink tap water. We have a packing of

2 seven bills today that would help do that, one of which is sponsored by Speaker Johnson. That's Intro 3 4 1053, which ensures that water tank inspection companies submit annual inspection reports directly 5 6 to the Health Department. We have Intro 1056-B 7 sponsored by Council Member Constantinides, which requires that the Department of Health itself conduct 8 inspections and audits of at least 125 tanks every 9 We have intro 1138-A sponsored by Council 10 Member Alicka Ampry-Samuel, which requires that DOH 11 12 conduct additional reviews of documentations of water 13 tank inspections without prior notice to building 14 owners in those cases when harmful bacteria or other 15 violations have been found in those tanks. We also 16 have Intro 1150-A sponsored by Council Member Kallos-17 Kallos, which allows DOHMH to require that water tank 18 inspection results are submitted electronically to Intro 1167-A sponsored by Council 19 the department. 20 Member Salamanca, which requires building owners to repair damage in water tank-tanks or face imposition 21 2.2 of a civil penalty if they fail to do so. Intro 1169 23 sponsored by Council Member Torres, which requires that visual evidence of water tanks such as photos 24 and videos be submitted along with inspection results 25

sent to the department, and finally, Intro 1157-B,
which I am pleased to be the lead sponsor, which
ensures that there are minimum qualifications met by
those individuals who are performing water tank
inspections to ensure that they are either licensed
master plumbers, work under the direct supervision of
licensed master plumbers or registered design
professionals, and for those who are doing water tank
cleaning, painting or coating that they hold
commercial pesticides applicator certification or
work under the direct supervision of a person holding
such certification. Wow. Okay, seven great bills,
an incredibly important package. I'm really proud of
the work of this committee and my colleagues and we
are now going to acknowledge first that we've been
joined by fellow Health Committee Member Dr. Mathieu
Eugene, and now we're going to going-going to cure
our Committee Counsel or Committee Clerk Billy Martin
to call the roll call.

COUNCIL MEMBER AMPRY-SAMUEL: I just want to explain my bill real quick. I am proud to be named in this package of bills and specifically proud to introduce Bill 1138-A, which requires the Department of Health and Mental Hygiene to review documentation of annual inspections, and water tanks where harmful bacteria are found, and to post the results online. This will allow for more accountability and for DOHMH to put more of an effort into pushing for building owners to have inspections done on their water tanks. Last year we had an incident in Breevort Houses in my district where a homeless man was found sleeping in one of our structures on top of the building and because this is where he slept, they had to empty out that entire area, empty out the tank, and then clean the tank, and when they cleaned the tank and tried to put the water back in, all of the pipes burst, and so a consequence to this homeless man being in the particular area was the fact that the pipes were just And so, there are so many consequences based on
