Ι 4 think it's still morning. I am Council Member 5 Adrienne Adam, the chair of the Subcommittee. We are 6 joined today by Council Members Koo, Miller and Chin. 7 Council Member Treyger is on his way. Council Member 8 Treyger has entered the room. Today, we will vote to 9 approve with modifications LU 410, the Haven Green 10 Senior Housing application related to property 11 located in Council Member Chin's district in 12 Manhattan. Submitted by HPD pursuant to Section 576-13 A2 of the Private Housing Finance Law and Section 14 197-C of the City Charter, the application requests 15 approval for the disposition of city-owned property 16 located at 199-207 Elizabeth Street, 222-230 Mott 17 Street, Block 493, Lot 30 to the project sponsor. 18 The proposed action would facilitate the development 19 of the new 7-story building with 123 affordable 20 housing units for seniors with on-site supportive 21 services, community facility space, a community room, 2.2 storefront retail space and public open space. Given 23 the level of public discourse surrounding this 24 application, I would like to take a moment to 25 acknowledge everyone, everyone who came to testify

Your voices were heard, and this project is better for it. 3 Through 4 negotiations with the Haven Green Development Team, 5 city agencies and the adjacent building owner at 21 Spring Street, we feel we have secured commitments 6 7 that represent a balanced project that will bring community benefits to the neighborhood, and the 8 broader city for decades to come. In addition to the 9 on-site open space, we have a letter of intent from 10 the owner of the neighbor-neighboring building at 21 11 12 Spring Street that memorializes a commitment to work with the Council, HPD, and the Development Team to 13 14 preserve the affordability on that site, and to work 15 to create a larger connected open space between the 16 two sites. We give our sincere thanks to the owners of 21 Spring Street, the DeMatteis Organization for 17 18 their willingness to engage with us to preserve affordability and improve the open space on both 19 20 sites. We have also strengthened the integrity of this project by ensuring the open space will be 21 2.2 preserved in perpetuity and become open to the public 23 for approximately 12 hours per day depending on the There will be a detailed maintenance and 24 season. repair plan that will be enforced by city agencies to 25

This project has a 60-year term regulatory 3 4 agreement, which has been strengthened to incentivize 5 permanent affordability. I know this has been a difficult conversation, but I also know that the 6 7 debate has led to a better project, and a better 8 outcome overall, and I want to thank everyone again for their commitment to all of these issues. We will 9 10 now vote to approve with modifications-oh, Council Member Chin, we look to you for remarks if you have 11 12 any today. 13 COUNCIL MEMBER CHIN: I just wanted to 14 thank everyone involved. It's been a long journey, 15 and I ask my colleagues to support this wonderful 16 project. Thank you, and thank you to our Chair. 17 Welcome back. 18 CHAIRPERSON ADAMS: Thank you, Council 19 Member Chin. We will vote to approve with 20 modifications CPC's decision on the Haven Green application, Preconsidered LU 410. Counsel, please 21 2.2 call the roll. 23 LEGAL COUNSEL: Adams. 24 CHAIRPERSON ADAMS: I vote aye. 25 LEGAL COUNSEL: Koo.
