14	We just made it under the wire. Welcome to
15	today's Finance Committee hearing. My name is
16	David Weprin. I chair the Committee. Today is
17	the first Finance Committee hearing since we
18	adopted the Fiscal 2010 Budget and the last
19	Finance hearing in Fiscal Year 2009.
20	Today we have several items on our
21	agenda. We have three Land Use items and a
22	Transparency Resolution. First let's start with
23	the three Land Use items.
24	This is a Preconsidered Resolution
25	that will provide a tax exemption for the West

Beth Corporation Housing Development Corporation in the Speaker's District. This property provides 383 units of rental housing to low income artists. Their prior tax exemption status expires today so they are seeking a new 40-year exemption. The Speaker supports this item.

The next item on our agenda is the 368 East 8<sup>th</sup> Street Housing Development Fund Corporation which provides 38 rental units for low income families. This building was acquired and rehabilitated in 1975 with a loan from HPD. Since then however increases in real estate values, utilities and insurance have increased operating costs therefore they are seeking a 30-year tax exemption. This item is in Council Member Rosie Mendez' District and she supports this item.

The last Land Use item is 72

Clinton Street Housing Development Fund Corp.

which is 1 building that provides 19 rental units

for low income families. This building was

acquired and rehabilitated in 1974 with a loan

from HPD. Since 1974 increases in real estate

values, utilities and insurance have obviously

increased, therefore they are seeking a 30-year

tax exemption pursuant to Section 577 of the

Private Housing Finance Law which provides tax

exemptions to HDFCs. This building is located in

Council Member Alan Gerson's District and he

supports this exemption.

Our last piece of legislation relates to the adopted Fiscal 2010 Expense Budget which we adopted on June 19<sup>th</sup>. This Transparency Resolution mostly makes technical corrections to the designated listed in the schedule. The Resolution also makes changes to designations made in Fiscal 2008 and Fiscal 2009. Council Members should have a list of these changes and in some cases additions which is attached to the Resolution.

For clarification purposes it is to be noted that organizations appearing in the Resolution that have not yet completed the prequalification process conducted by the Mayor's Office of Contract Services by the Council or other government agency are identified in the attached charts with an asterisk.

Additionally, with all Transparency Resolutions, Council Members will have to sign a

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disclosure form indicating whether or not a
conflict exists with any of the groups on the
attached list. If a Council Member has a
potential conflict of interest with any of the
organizations listed he or she may want to
disclose the conflict at the time of their vote

We will have representatives from

Council Finance available to answer any questions
you have regarding the Land Use items or

Transparency Resolution. Let me introduce my
colleagues that are here. We have Council Member

Eric Gioia from Queens; Council Member Helen Sears
from Queens; Council Member Vincent Gentile from

Brooklyn; Council Member Diana Reyna from Brooklyn
and Queens; Council Member Lew Fidler from
