COMMITTEE: Education

TITLE: A Local Law to amend the New York city charter, in relation to requiring the New York city department of education to provide the metropolitan transportation authority with certain student enrollment information.

SPONSORS: Council Members Ignizio, Brewer, Comrie, Fidler, Gonzalez, Jackson, James, Liu, Palma, Vacca and White

SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION: This bill would require the Department of Education ("DOE") to report to the Metropolitan Transportation Authority ("MTA") the name and address of any DOE school scheduled to open in the upcoming school year along with the school's anticipated student enrollment and the zip codes of the enrolled students' addresses and the percent of enrolled students who reside in each zip code. The required report would also include the name and address of any school expecting a 200 or more student increase in enrollment for the upcoming school year along with the zip codes of the new students and the percentage of new students residing in each zip code. The report would be due to the MTA no later that August 15 of each year.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This local law would become effective sixty days after its enactment into law
