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MICHAEL LEONARDO: Check, check, this is the prerecorded sound test for the Committee on Parks and Rec. It's being recorded by Michael Leonardo.

CHAIRPERSON KOO: Good morning, everyone. Yeah, the meeting is going to start now. [gavel] Good morning. I'm Council Member Peter Koo and I'm pleased to chair the Committee on Parks and Recreation. And we here joined by Council Members Adams, Moya, Gjonaj, Van Bramer, Rivera, and Council Member Cohen. Today the committee will be voting on a preconsidered bill that [inaudible] co-named 86 Thoroughfares in Public Places Throughout the City. This is our semi-annual bill where we seek to honor the individuals and organizations that have made lasting contributions to the people of our city. Some of this includes co-names for active community members, heroic New Yorkers who sacrificed their lives for others, people who committed their lives to public services, or those who greatly enriched the city's culture landscape. I'm proud to support this bill and I urge my colleagues on the committee to vote in favor of this legislation. Thank you. before we vote, any members want to make any comments

of the tremendous amount of tragedy that Community

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2	Board 1 has seen. So I just wanted to note this
3	particular street and just, I state, we all
4	appreciate the vitally important role of the police
5	in our community and the fallen officer, Sergeant
6	McNaughton, whose life was tragically lost in the
7	valorous service in Iraq. But when a community board
8	votes against co-naming a street it must have an
9	important reason for doing so and its members do not
10	expect that their views will be disregarded without
11	directly engaging them, without sharing any
12	reasoning, and without confronting the community's
13	reasoning. This small act raises large questions
14	about the integrity of our community board process.
15	The council should be urged to consider allowing the
16	community and the community board that represents
17	them to have an opportunity to further discuss and
18	consider these street co-namings. The community
19	board was not made aware that the street co-naming
20	was going through without any consideration. In
21	other words, we as members did not know this was
22	going through. We also want to add that Sergeant
23	McNaughton, and I'm speaking on behalf of myself,
24	certainly, not Community Board 1, Sergeant McNaughtor
25	has been honored with a bronze plaque on the Canal

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2	Street Subway with his name entered on the police
3	memorial in the Battery and honored with namings in
4	several hours in home towns in Long Island.
5	Community Board 1 has had immense loss and many
6	heroes who merit recognition, from the lost of 9/11,
7	the recent terror acts in Hudson River Park, to the
8	many fallen heroes in their line of duty. The
9	community rightly must be very careful to be fair to
LO	all those worthy of honor. Thank you.

21	died at 108 years of age. She happened to live on
22	my block, and she was an early pioneer, working until
23	she was 96 years old, and when she left her
24	employment she sued her employer for age

discrimination because she still wanted to work. She

23	to his community, among many other things. He
24	happened to be the very first African American
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manager of Dan's Supreme Supermarket in Jamaica. He

3	Queens, and I proudly vote aye on all.

8	CHAIRPERSON KOO: We will hold the vote

12	Committee on Parks and Recreation. The item is
13	adopted by the committee, 8 in the affirmative, zero
14	in the negative, and no abstentions.
