CHAIRPERSON RICHARDS: All righty, good morning, good morning everyone. I'm Council Member Donovan Richards from the 31st District in Queens, and I'm chair of the Public Safety Committee. I want to acknowledge my colleagues. We are joined by Council Members Brannan, Deutsch, Menchaca, Lancman, Vallone, Powers, Adams, Cohen. All righty, I got it right. Today we are voting on a very important bill, Introduction 1349-A, a Local Law in relation to requiring the police department to implement childsensitive arrest policies. Part of the goal of this bill is to prevent what we all saw happen to Jazmine Headley. We saw the video. I don't need to say much more than this. It was terrible to watch and we want to make sure that never happens again. This bill is about properly training officers to handle one of the most difficult situations they can face, what to do with a child of an arrested caregiver. Being a police officer is not just about making arrests and enforcing the law, it's about doing that work

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2 compassionately and with respect for the humanity of the people they deal with every day, even the people 3 4 they are arresting. And especially the children, who 5 have done nothing wrong, but who are faced with the 6 trauma of watching a parent or loved one taken away 7 in handcuffs, sometimes with no one to care for them other than the officers who arrested them. 8 Minimizing that trauma is an important goal and this 9 10 bill outlines clear steps the department should be training its officers to take in order to achieve 11 12 that goal. Ultimately, this bill is about doing things better, not just keeping us safe but treating 13 14 our citizens and our children how they deserve to be 15 treated. It also contains important provisions 16 making sure that that we are involving the Administration for Children's Services in the 17 18 appropriate situations and only in the appropriate situations, so that being arrested doesn't lead to 19 20 needless interference in family relationships and the communities where we have seen too much law 21 2.2 enforcement activity. I want to thank Council Member 23 Dromm for sponsoring this bill, and I know he's out to vote and it's an exciting day for him to pass this 24 25 But, more importantly, I want to acknowledge

that children and their parents could be treated in a
