Today the committee will vote on Resolution 978 sponsored by my new colleague who is already kicking it... hitting out of the ballpark, Council Member Farah Louis, a Resolution calling upon congress to pass and the President to sign the violence against women reauthorization act of 2019. I want to welcome my colleagues Majority Leader Cumbo, Council Member Lander, Council Member Louis, Council Member Ayala, Council Member Ben Kallos and at this point turn it over to Council Member Louis for a statement about her Resolution, Council Member.

everyone. I'm here today, today to ask for all of your support on Resolution 978 which calls upon congress and the president to reauthorize the violence against women act. I am a survivor of domestic abuse, as a survivor I can tell you firsthand that the resources tailored to survivors such as the family justice center is not just a public institution or a place for services but it is

COMMITTEE ON WOMEN AND GENDER EQUITY a lifeline for people that feel hopeless and it is a place of refuge so by passing this resolution we're paving the way for survivor center justice and life saving legislation. Every year the needs around domestic and gender-based violence becomes more and more apparent as we continue to give space to survivors to speak and to heal and New York City those needs are definitely urgent. When we review crimes, crime stats... the stats that NYPD show us every year shows us that crime rates in New York City have declined however and in the past ten years we see the number of domestic violence related homicides have increased. The NYPD responded to over 250,000 domestic incident reports in 2018 alone so I'm hopeful that the reauthorization of this bill will only lead to further efforts to prevent gender based violent crimes through justice reform, education for the public, grants that will provide invaluable resources to survivors through initiatives like the family justice center. I definitely want to thank today all committee members for being here and for considering this essential resolution and I definitely want to thank Brenda, Chloe and Monica for your hard work on this resolution and it definitely

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is an honor to advocate for survivors of domestic and gender based violence especially if it means that we can equip them as well as the general public with the tools to ensure that we see a reduction in domestic abuse, sexual harassment and all gender based violence in our lifetime. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON ROSENTHAL: Thank you very much Council Member, appreciate you. Appreciate you Council Member Ayala, this is really important stuff and as I've said before domestic and gender based violence represents serious and complex issues that can effect any New Yorker regardless of identity; women, men, transgender, gender non-conforming individuals of every race, religion, culture and status are impacted. These acts of violence are constituted of power dynamics that reflect greater trends in our society which disproportionality harm the most vulnerable and marginalized among us. At a time when women's rights and gender-based violence are becoming increasingly partisan issues, Resolution Number 978 would reauthorize VAWA and also include among other things protections for transgender individuals and a provision that would prohibit those convicted of certain misdemeanor chargers from
