COMMITTEE: Environmental Protection

TITLE: A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to backflow prevention device reporting and certification.

Sponsor: By Council Members Gennaro, Comrie, Fidler, James, Koppell, Nelson, Weprin, Gerson and White Jr.

SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION: This legislation provides an amendment to the current administrative code of the City of New York, in relation to backflow prevention device reporting and certification. The Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) shall submit a report to the City Council setting forth the number of hazardous facilities and all other facilities which DEP knows have had required backflow prevention devices installed and the number of facilities in each category that have been notified by DEP of the need to install one or more backflow prevention devices on or before January 1, 2010. After which DEP will submit a report every July 1st and January 1st detailing the number of facilities in each category for which one or more backflow prevention devices were installed since the last report was required, the number of facilities in each category that have been newly notified by the department of the need to install such devices, and the number of violations issued by the department for the failure to install a required backflow prevention device.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This local law would take effect ninety days after enactment.
