SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION: This legislation provides an amendment to the current administrative code of the City of New York, in relation to asbestos abatement activities in buildings undgergoing demolition. There shall be no asbestos abatement activities performed within a building simultaneously with demolition work. Prior to the issuance of a full or partial demolition permit by the Department of Buildings (DOB), the owner of the building to be demolished shall submit to the DOB a certification, in a form to be provided by the rules of the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), that the building is free of asbestos containing material or, documentation that the Commissioner of DEP has issued a variance from this requirement. A variance would be issued if the demolition to be performed is emergency work where the emergency warrants immediate commencement of the full or partial demolition with asbestos in place.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This local law would take effect one hundred and eighty days after enactment.
