2 Microphone check. Today's date is  
3 September 5, 2019, Committee on Standards and Ethics  
4 being recorded by John Biando, 14<sup>th</sup> Floor, Committee  
5 Room.

6 CHAIRMAN MATTEO: Good morning everyone.  
7 I am Steve Matteo, Chair of the Standards and Ethics  
8 Committee. We're joined by my colleagues Karen  
9 Koslowitz and Margaret Chin and our committee  
10 counsel, Serena Longley [phonetic]. The Committee on  
11 Standards and Ethics is meeting today regarding a  
12 pending disciplinary matter opened pursuant to  
13 Section 10.80 of the Council rules concerning Council  
14 Member Andy King. We are also meeting to address  
15 additional and unrelated Committee business. Because  
16 it is necessary for the Committee to discuss  
17 confidential personnel issues, I am making a motion  
18 for the Committee to move into executive session  
19 pursuant to Article 7 of the Public Officer's Law.  
20 Do I have a second?

21 COUNCIL MEMBER KOSLOWITZ: I second.

22 CHAIRMAN MATTEO: I have a second from  
23 Karen Koslowitz that we move into executive session.  
24 All those in favor say aye.

25 COUNCIL MEMBERS: Aye, aye

2 CHAIRMAN MATTEO: Aye. Noting that the  
3 ayes have it, I am going to close this portion of the  
4 meeting and reopen in executive session. Before we  
5 proceed into executive session, I will note for the  
6 public that the Committee may vote on certain items  
7 of business during the session and as a result there  
8 may be additional open session of the Committee later  
9 today. [gavel]

10 [pause]

11 CHAIRMAN MATTEO: [gavel] Okay, good  
12 morning again. Thank you for your patience. Again,  
13 I'm Steve Matteo, chair of the Committee on Standards  
14 and Ethics joined by Karen Koslowitz and Margaret  
15 Chin and Serena Longley, our committee counsel. The  
16 Committee is now returning to open session to make  
17 public the outcome of today's votes. As laid out in  
18 our public statement of August 21, after a wide range  
19 investigation conducted by both the Council's Office  
20 of the General Counsel and the special counsel  
21 retained by the Committee to prosecute this  
22 disciplinary proceeding, the Committee voted to issue  
23 four charges against Council Member King. These  
24 charges are related to alleged retaliation,  
25 disorderly conduct, conflict of interest violations

2 and harassment. Since this Committee's last meeting  
3 which took place on August 21, it has come to  
4 attention that Council Member King has engaged in  
5 additional retaliatory behavior against staff members  
6 and additional conflict of interest violations. Upon  
7 learning of this retaliatory conduct as well as  
8 apparent additional conflicts of interest violations,  
9 the Office of the General Counsel in conjunction with  
10 the special counsel immediately investigated and  
11 uncovered corroborating evidence. Based upon this  
12 evidence, this Committee has voted today to issue  
13 additional and superseding charges relating to this  
14 retaliatory behavior. Pursuant to the rules of the  
15 Council, this Committee will now hold a disciplinary  
16 hearing on the charges issued on August 21 as well as  
17 these superseding charges. At this time, the  
18 disciplinary hearing is scheduled to begin on  
19 September 13 at 10 a.m. Please note, however, that  
20 the date and time of the proceeding may be  
21 rescheduled at the discretion of the Chair of the  
22 Committee. The hearing will be held in executive  
23 session and Council Member King has a right to be  
24 represented by counsel at the hearing. The Council  
25 has hired Cary Cohen to serve as special counsel and

2 present the case against Council Member King to the  
3 Committee. While the proceedings are confidential,  
4 after the Committee deliberates on the charges, the  
5 findings and recommendations of the Committee will be  
6 made public.

7           In addition to these superseding charges  
8 against Council Member King, the Committee voted  
9 today on a pending matter pertaining to Council  
10 Member Barry Grodenchik. On February 12, 2019, this  
11 Committee voted to open a matter into allegations  
12 that Council Member Grodenchik had violated the  
13 Council's policy against harassment and  
14 discrimination. After a full investigation and  
15 substantiation of these allegations, this Committee  
16 negotiated a settlement agreement with Council Member  
17 Grodenchik. This agreement, as well as a related  
18 public statement by the Council Member before the  
19 Committee, took place on May 14, 2019. Now this  
20 Committee has been informed that the Council Member  
21 has successfully completed the remaining term of his  
22 settlement agreement, a specialized multi-session  
23 training on preventing sexual harassment. This  
24 training was personally paid for by the Council  
25 Member. Based upon this development, the Committee

2 is satisfied that the Council Member has fully  
3 complied with and completed the terms of this  
4 settlement agreement and we voted today to formally  
5 close his pending matter. This concludes our summary  
6 of the Committee's votes during today's meeting and  
7 I'm going to adjourn the meeting. Thank you. [gavel]
