Corporations in recent years have 14 increasingly been using various forms of independent 15 contractors and freelancers, and contingent work. 16 It's estimated that as many as 1.3 million New 17 Yorkers maybe a third of the workforce is freelance 18 independent contractors at this point, and the New 19 York City Human Rights Law as strong as it is and 20 with as many protections that it has to protect 21 people from discrimination based on race, religion, 2.2 gender identity, sexual orientation, age, sexual harassment is not clear on whether it covers 23 24 independent contractors and freelancers. Intro 136-A 25 will end that on unclarity. What that has meant is
