CHAIRPERSON SALAMANCA: Alright, good morning, and welcome to the Committee on Land Use. I am Council Member Rafael Salamanca, the chair of this committee. I want to welcome my esteemed colleagues who are-who are members of this committee, and are present today. We have Council Members Deutsch, Koo, Lancman, Grodenchik, Chair Adams, Diaz, Chair Moya, and Rivera. I want to thank Chair Moya and Chair Adams for their work on our Land Use Subcommittees. Today, we will vote to approve LU 603 for the 147-40 15th Avenue Rezoning Proposal relating to property in Council Member Vallone's district. The application seeks approval for a zoning map amendment to map a C12 Commercial Overlay District within an existing R3A district along the south side of 15th Avenue between 147th Street and 149th Street in Whitestone, Queens, and they would bring an existing building with two stories of commercial office use into conformance with the zoning. We will vote to approve the modifications of LU 604 and 605, the 22-60 46th Street Rezoning relating to property in Council Member Constantinides' district in Queens. The application for a zoning map amendment to rezone the

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block from R4 and M1-1 districts to R4 and R6A 2 3 districts with a C2-3 commercial overlay along 45th Street. There is a related zoning text amending to 4 5 establish a Mandatory Inclusionary Housing area utilizing Option 2 and the Workforce option. A 6 7 modification would be to remove the MIH Workforce option, and add Option 1. These actions would 8 facilitate the construction of a new mixed-use building with eight story portions along 45th Street 10 and 46th Street as well an approximately 250-seat 11 theater. From our Landmarks Subcommittee we will 12 vote to approve five individual landmark designations 13 for properties located in the districts of Council 14 15 Members Lander and Levin. These landmarks have been designated in connection with the proposed Gowaus 16 17 Rezoning. They are LU 597, the Landmark designation 18 of the Somers Brothers Tinware Factory later known as 19 the American Can Company located 361-363 3rd Avenue. 20 LU 598, the landmark designation of the Brooklyn Rapid Transit Company, Central Power Station Engine 21 House located at 153 Second Street. LU 599 the 2.2 2.3 landmark designation of the Montauk Paint Manufacturing Company Building located at 170th 24

Second Avenue. LU 600 the landmark designation of

the Gowanus Flushing Tunnel Pumping Station and
Gatehouse located at 201 Douglas Street and LU 601
the landmark designation of the American Society for
the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Brooklyn Office,
Shelter and Garage Building located at 233 Butler
Street including a portion of the sidewalk. Finally,
we will vote to approve Preconsidered LU20205259SEQ,
an application submitted pursuant to Section 1731 of
the New York School Construction Authority Act. The
proposed site selection for a new approximately 476-
street—so 476-seat primary school Q-340 to be located
at 69-02 Queens Boulevard in Queens is in Community
School District 24 in Council Member Holden's
district. Are there any questions or remarks from
members of the committee? Alright, seeing none, I
will now call for a vote in accordance with the
recommendations of the Subcommittees and local
Council Members to approve Preconsidered LUs 202, 05,
259SEQ, LUs 597 through 601, and LU 693 and to
