CHAIRPERSON AVELLA: Good morning, 3 everyone, I'd like to call this meeting of the 4 5 Subcommittee on Zoning and Franchises to order. We have two items on the agenda that we will be 6 voting on. But first let me introduce the members of the Committee that are here. Council Members 9 Al Vann, Larry Seabrook, Joel Rivera, and Simcha The two items we will be voting on first 10 Felder. 11 is the Western Rail Yards, which lies within 12 Speaker Quinn's district. And there have been 13 ongoing negotiations, and there is a very extensive modification that we will be approving. 14 15 Just quickly, let me go over some of the 16 highlights of the modification, and we'll submit 17 the text of the modification into the record. First of all, under the original proposal, it was 18 unknown as to how much affordable housing would be 19 20 present; in the application now there is a 21 commitment that over 20 percent of the units will 22 be affordable through a mix of programs, and that 23 they will be permanently affordable. There will 24 also be more public members on the governing board 25 of the open space that is allocated during the, as

Mr. Chair, good morning, everyone. Let me just say that while I tend to vote aye on all, meaning a vote in the affirmative on the, on the Western Yards, an affirmative vote to deny the situation with the Kingsbridge Armory, I am not happy. not happy at the parties that we could, appear as though we could not resolve the issues and concerns of their--because I am afraid of the impact that that's going to have on the future of The Bronx, as far as Kingsbridge Armory, and the thousands of construction jobs that may not go forward. But also I'm afraid and not happy about the fact that the powers that be, the powers that be in the City of New York, and I'm not talking about he 1.2 million residents of The Bronx, I'm talking about Mayor Bloomberg and all of his Commissioners, and the leaders of The Bronx could not come together to work out this situation. do know the negative impact of this. I say I do

2	know because my entire family, brothers, sisters,
3	nieces, nephews, all live in The Bronx. I do know
4	that a family based on the federal poverty level,
5	is \$22,000, and that the jobs that's being
6	discussed, which are not part of the Land Use
7	process, that if in fact \$10 an hour with
8	benefits, that would only reap about \$21,700 a
9	year, which is less than the poverty level set by
10	the U.S. government. And if in fact if it was
11	even \$8 an hour, it would be so little that most
12	of the families, if not all of them, would still
13	depend on the City of New York for services, for
14	food stamps, for Medicaid and other things like
15	that. It's a shame that we can't get together.
16	And in fact, I wish that we could stop the clock
17	right now. Stop the clock right now, and is there
18	any way we can stop the clock right now, and have
19	these individuals that are discussing this
20	particular matter, go in a room and close the door
21	ad don't come out until you resolve the matter on
22	behalf of the people of New York City? People of
23	The Bronx. That's what I would like. I really do
24	not want to vote right now. So Mr. Chair, is
25	there any way we could stop the clock on this

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2	particular matter?
3	CHAIRPERSON AVELLA: No. Today,
4	this is it, this is it, this is the drop dead
5	date.
6	COUNCIL MEMBER JACKSON: What time
7	today? What time today? Is it 11:59 p.m.? I'm
8	asking what time is the last second that we can
9	CHAIRPERSON AVELLA: Council
10	Member, the vote has already taken place, I'm
11	COUNCIL MEMBER JACKSON: I
12	understand as far as the vote.
13	CHAIRPERSON AVELLA: You've been
14	called on to, to
15	COUNCIL MEMBER JACKSON: But I'm
16	talking about as far as when does the City Council
17	have to act? Is it by 11:59 p.m. today?
18	CHAIRPERSON AVELLA: By close of
19	business today. Yeah, but the Council has to act.
20	COUNCIL MEMBER JACKSON: Well, I'm
21	encouraging the parties to go and still try to
22	resolve it. Even though I'm voting yes on both
23	items, meaning yes going forward with Western
24	Yards, and yes, a yes vote to affirmatively deny
25	the Kingsbridge Armory, I am not pleased about it.

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2	And so with that, that's my statement, and I, II
3	beg the parties to go in the room and work it out.
4	CHAIRPERSON AVELLA: Council
5	Member, did you vote?
6	COUNCIL MEMBER JACKSON: I did.
7	Initially, I said I vote aye on both.
8	CHAIRPERSON AVELLA: Okay.
9	COUNSEL: Council Member Katz.
LO	COUNCIL MEMBER KATZ: I abstent.

12	COUNSEL: Vote now standsseven in
L3	the affirmative, one abstention on LUs 1260
L4	through 1268, motion approved with modification,
L5	referred to City Planning. And vote stands six in

18	disapprove.
