3	My name is Kendall Stewart and I am Chair of the
4	City Council's Committee on Immigration. I would
5	like to recognize the other members of the
6	committee who are here today. We have Council
7	Member Barron, Council Member Mealy, Council
8	Member Palma, Council Member Eugene and Council
9	Member Ferreras.
10	I would also like to recognize the
11	committee staff Julene Beckford, counsel to the
12	committee, and Israel Rodriguez, who is policy
13	analyst to the committee.
14	Today the committee will vote on
15	Proposed Resolution 1087-A. This Resolution calls
16	on the United States Congress to pass the
17	Development, Relief and Education for Alien Minors
18	Act of 2009.
19	Despite the fact that many
20	undocumented children are raised in the United
21	States, attend local schools and identify with
22	American culture, existing immigration laws and
23	financial obstacles create unique barriers for
24	undocumented youth pursuing higher education.
25	Children account for 1.8 million,

2	or 15%, of the approximately 12 million
3	undocumented immigrants living in the United
4	States. Current laws have no provisions for
5	undocumented young people to legalize their
6	status.
7	Passage of the DREAM Act will
8	provide a path to lawful permanent residence for
9	undocumented youth who pursue a higher education.
10	As such, undocumented young people brought to the
11	United States at a young age by their parents will
12	no longer be punished for the indiscretions of
13	their parents.
14	The Council heard unanimous support
15	on Resolution 1087 during a joint hearing on the
16	Committees on Immigration and Higher Education
17	held on October 24, 2007. The Committee on
18	Immigration has consistently supported the
19	immigrant community because of the positive
20	contributions made to New York City. I urge my
21	colleagues to continue to support this community
22	by voting in support of Proposed Resolution 1087-
23	A. I would like to call the vote.
