COMMITTEE ON FIRE AND EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT overtime pay to ensure they are earning a living wage. This was before the COVID-19 outbreak in New York City. During this deadly pandemic EMS workers have literally been the city's first responders in providing essential medical assistance. In this challenging time for New York City our EMS workers provided to all the vital and heroic role they have always served. The pay disparity between EMS workers another first responders has long existed and it is overdue for our mayor to provide these essential workers with benefits and pay they deserve. I would now like to invite Council Member Miller, the sponsor of today's resolution being voted on to make brief statement. Council Member Miller, you have the couch.
