CHAIRPERSON NELSON: Let's begin
the meeting on the Council of Civil Service and
Labor. Good afternoon. I'm Council Member Mike
Nelson. I chair the Committee on Civil Service
and Labor. Today the committee will hold a vote
on proposed resolution number 1924-A. This Reso
calls on Congress to alter the James Zadroga 9-11
Health and Compensation Act

The Zadroga Act would provide many persons exposed to the toxins of Ground Zero a right to be medically monitored and confers upon many who are sick as a result of such exposure, a right to treatment. Thank you for attending today's hearing.

It's been estimated that almost 100,000 workers and volunteers participated in the rescue, recovery and clean up on and after 9-11.

Many of these workers were New York City uniformed personnel, including members of the FDNY, including Emergency Medical Services workers, the NYPD, the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, the Department of Sanitation and the Department of Corrections. In addition, area workers, residents and students were also directly

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2 exposed to the World Trade Center attack.

Although the New York City 3 4 Council's in favor of many aspects of the Sadroga 5 Bill, Reso number 924-A. It urges Congress to amend certain aspects of the bill. 6 resolution would go further. Woludl call for the House version of the bill to be amended in 9 accordance with the Senate version, which would cut the city's responsibility of funding under the 10 act from a maximum of half a billion dollars to a 11 12 maximum of a quarter of a billion dollars. That's 13 B, Billions.

The resolution would also cite evidence tending to show a causing 4 dollars.

That's B, Billions. The resolution would also cite evidence intending to show a causal connection between cancers and exposures to 9-11 toxins and would call on Congress to strongly consider adding cancer as an enumerated condition under the Act.

Today we've been joined by members of the Committee, Council Members James Gennaro and Larry Seabrook. I'd like to also thank staff, Jennifer Wilcox, the legislative analyst and

14	be added to the resolution if at all possible. I
15	vote aye.
