SERGEANT BIONDO: Okay, good morning everyone and welcome to today's Remote New York City Council vote on the Committee of Consumer Affairs and Business Licensing.

At this time, we ask all panelists to please their video on for verification purposes and to minimize disruptions, please place all electronic devices on vibrate or silent. Thank you so much Chair Cohen. We are ready to begin.

CHAIRPERSON COHEN: I am going to place my phone on vibrate because I am following directions.

SERGEANT BIONDO: Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON COHEN: Alright, good morning. My
name is Andrew Cohen and I am the Chair of the
Committee on Consumer Affairs and Business Licensing,
at least until we pass today's legislation.

I am joined today by my colleagues on the

Committee. I'm going to have to enlarge my Zoom to

figure out who is here. Let's see, I see Council

Member Koo, Council Member Chin, Council Member Yeger

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is out of his chair but he's nearby, Council Member
Brannan. Am I missing anybody.

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COUNCIL MEMBER KOSLOWITZ: Don't forget me.

COUNCIL MEMBER COHEN: Council Member Koslowitz, right there in the left. I missed you, I'm sorry about that. I'll introduce more as people arrive.

Today we will be voting on Proposed Introduction 1609-A that was heard last year by the request of the Mayor.

The Department of Consumer Affairs was first codified as an agency by legislation passed in 1969. Since that time, the Department has acted as a vital advocate for New York City's consumers. As Chair of the Committee responsible for overseeing the Department, I've been pleased with the different initiatives that the Council and the Department have been able to implement together to strengthen protections for New Yorkers, especially during this health emergency.

In the short time that I have been Chair, we have codified the provisions of the Mayors Executive Order related to outdoor dining and extended the renewal time for many licenses and permits. We also enacted my bill 1916-A which waved all fees related to

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sidewalk cafés. In doing so, we've utilized our jurisdictional powers to provide what relief we can to the city's struggling small businesses.

Today's vote aims to strengthen another facet of the departments focus area, worker protections.

Since the passage of Local Law 104 of 2015, which established the Office of Labor and Policy Standards or OLPS, DCA has seen its mandate broaden substantially. In addition to licensing and educating businesses on their obligations and protecting consumers, DCA is also responsible for overseeing the city's labor laws. It is encouraging to see the success of the Department is already at gain in securing restitution for workers whose employers have violated the law. Such as paid Safe and Sick Leave and the Freelancers Isn't Free Act.

The bill we are voting on today, Intro. 1609-A which formally changed DCA'S name to the Department of Consumer and Worker Protection or DCWP. It would also consolidate OLPS and the division of aid care within DCWP and transfer their respective legal powers to DWCP. Furthermore, this bill would allow the department to seek restitution as a remedy at oath which it previously could only seek in court.
