8	SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Good morning and welcome
9	to the Committee on Finance. At this time, would all
10	panels please turn on their videos? I repeat. All
11	panelists, please turn on your videos. Thank you.
12	To minimize disruption, please place all electronic
13	devices to vibrate or silence. I repeat. Please
14	plate all electronic devices to vibrate or silent.
15	Chair Dromm, we are ready to begin.
16	CHAIRPERSON DROMM: Okay. Thank you
17	very much. Thank you very much and good morning and
18	welcome to today's finance committee meeting. I am
19	Council member Daniel Dromm and I am the Chair of the
20	committee. We have been joined by the following
21	Council members. Council members Cornegy, Cumbo,
22	Koslowitz, Rosenthal, Van Bramer, Grodenchik, Adams,
23	Ayala, Moya, Powers, Louis, Matteo, Gjonaj, Amprty-
24	Samuel, Chin, Brannan, Perkins, and Cohen. Today,
25	the committee will be voting on seven items which

2 includes four bills, two land-use items and a 3 transparency resolution. Let's start with the four 4 pieces of legislation. Proposed intro number 2039A, sponsored by myself at the request of the Mayor would 5 extend the deadline for the filing of an application 6 7 or a renewal application due in calendar year 2020 from March 16th, 2020 to July 15th, 2020 for certain 8 9 real property tax exemption or tax abatement The programs include the Senior Citizen 10 programs. 11 Homeowners Exemption, the Disabled Homeowners 12 Exemption, the Veterans Exemption, and the 13 Alternative Veterans Exemption, the School Tax Relief 14 Exemption, the Disabled Crime Victim Good Samaritan 15 Exemption, the Clergy Exemption, and the Cooperative and Condominium Property Tax Abatement. Due to the 16 17 COVID-19 pandemic, New York City was forced to shut 18 down the normal order of business to help stop the 19 spread of coronavirus which included gatherings of 20 people at workshops, seminars, and in person visits 21 top offices to normally assist people navigating 2.2 technical matters by filling out real property tax 23 application and renewal documents. According to the Department of Finance, approximately 2650 eligible 24 initial and renewal applications were received after 25

the existing deadline of March 16th, 2020, but prior to July 15th, 2020. By extending the deadline for filing the property tax exemption and tax abatement programs to July 15th, this bill will make sure that these property owners can receive their tax benefits now instead of having to wait until next year to apply again.

9 Next is proposed intro number 1225A. This bill, which I have also sponsored, would require 10 11 the Department of Finance to make best efforts to 12 collect the name, telephone number, and email address 13 of all owners of real property and, once such 14 information is received, to ensure that it is 15 maintained in a computer database used by the Department for purposes of administering the real 16 17 property tax. Currently, the Department of Finance 18 does not have a systematic approach to collecting and 19 maintaining telephone and email contact information 20 for property owners in order to communicate with them 21 regarding their properties and property taxes. Instead, it primarily relies on physical mailings to 2.2 23 contact owners. This bill will encourage the agency to collect the data necessary to use alternative, 24 more effective methods of communication and outreach 25

2	to dismantle to disseminate information of
3	property owners in a faster, more efficient way. I'd
4	like to thank the counsel finance division staff who
5	worked on these two bills. Senior counsel Rebecca
6	Chiasson, assistant counsel assistant director
7	Emra Edev [sp?], Assistant counsel Stephanie Ruiz,
8	and finance analyst Luke Zangarle [sp?]. Excuse me
9	if I messed up the pronunciation of that last name.
10	Next is proposed intro 1702A. This bill,
11	sponsored by Council member Koslowitz, would require
12	that Department of Finance to included notice of
13	property tax bills that used prior year tax rate that
14	the taxes due are subject to adjustment upon the
15	adoption of the tax rate for the new fiscal year.
16	And the last of the bills is proposed
17	intro number 1705A. This bill, sponsored by Council
18	member Matteo, would require the Department of
19	Finance to establish and maintain a system to contact
20	property owners by email and provide access
21	electronically to the receipt for an information on
22	each payment made for charges on their statement of
23	account. I will now give Counsel members Koslowitz
24	and Matteo an opportunity to speak about their
25	legislation. Council member Koslowitz?

2	COUNCIL MEMBER KOSLOWITZ: This is just
3	to notify people. Many people get their bill in June
4	and they get surprised with they get another bill and
5	the bill that comes in June will tell them what this
6	bill is all about and there will be another bill
7	coming so they won't be surprised when they get the
8	bill. I've gotten many calls in the office claiming
9	that, I paid it and why am I getting another bill?
10	So, this will alleviate that problem.
11	CHAIRPERSON DROMM: Thank you, Council
12	member Koslowitz. Minority Leader Matteo?
13	MINORITY LEADER MATTEO: Thank you,
14	Chair Dromm. Intro 1705 will create an electronic
15	receipt system for payments on property taxes. Since
16	the city instituted the electronic payment system,
17	there has been no proof of payment issued by the city
18	for online payers of property taxes. You can get a
19	receipt if you pay in person at one of the New York
20	City Department of finance centers, but not online.
21	Payers have to wait for the next quarterly statement
22	to know with certainty that TOS has properly
23	attributed their payment to their account. This
24	legislation will change and allow individuals to sign
25	up for payment receipts related to their property or

2 at the point of payment so that they have a 3 definitive statement from the city that their tax 4 bill has been paid. This is just basic fairness and makes the online payment system the city has had for 5 some time even more convenient. This legislation 6 7 will not come into effect until next fiscal year 8 because I am sensitive to adding the cost of our 9 agencies during this challenging time, even if it is not a minimal cost and I wanted to ensure that this 10 11 new feature did not make belt-tightening any harder than it needed to be. I think the administration for 12 13 negotiating this legislation and good faith and appreciate the work that was done to bring the bill 14 15 to passage, especially Kenny Grace. I want to thank Jason Goldman, our finance committee counsel Rebecca 16 17 Chiasson, Emory Evas, Stephanie Ruiz, and my Chief of 18 Staff David Carr. I also want to thank the Speaker 19 and Chair Dromm for their support and I urge my 20 colleagues to vote yes. Thank you. 21 CHAIRPERSON DROMM: Thank you very

22 much, Minority Leader Matteo. We have also been 23 joined by Council member Yeger. Next, we have two 24 resolutions related to the property tax exemptions. 25 The two resolutions relate to a project called Albany

Kingston in Council member Cornegy's district. The resolutions would approve the termination of two prior article five tax exemptions granted by the Council in 2007 and consent to do voluntary dissolution of the current article five owners. Council member Cornegy is supportive of these actions.

9 The last item is the transparency resolution. The transparency resolution sets forth 10 11 the new designation and changes in the designation of 12 certain organizations receiving local, aging, anti-13 poverty, and youth discretionary funding and funding 14 pursuant to certain initiatives in the budget. As 15 with all transparency resolutions, Council members 16 will have to sign a disclosure form indicating 17 whether or not a conflict exists with any of the 18 groups on the attached list. If any Council member 19 has a potential conflict of interest with any of the 20 organizations listed, he or she has the opportunity to disclose the conflict at the time of their vote. 21 As a reminder, please disclose any conflicts you may 2.2 23 have with proposed subcontractors used by organizations sponsored by discretionary funding. 24 These disclosures must be made before the 25

3	completed and submitted prior to the vote on the
4	transparency resolution may be emailed to Charles
5	Davis. We have also been joined by Council members
6	Koo and Cohen and are there any questions on any of
7	these legislations? Okay. I will now ask Billy
8	Martin, committee clerk, to call the role.
