2 SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Looks good, Ralph.

SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Thank you. Good morning, everyone. I'm Steven Matteo. I'm Chair of the Committee on Standards and Ethics and we are joined by my committee colleagues today. Council members Gibson, Chin, Koslowitz, and Levin. committee is now returning to open session to make public the outcome of today's votes on the disciplinary matter against Council member King. Today, the Committee on Standards and Ethics found the charges against Council member King to have been substantiated and is recommending the sanction of expulsion to the full Council. As you may recall, the four charges were violations of the Council's antidiscrimination and harassment policies, prohibited against harassment and discrimination based upon gender, medical condition, or disability. Violations of conflict of interest laws contained in chapter 68 of the city charter, and Council rules prohibiting misappropriation and misuse of Council funds and violations of Council resolution number 1138 of 2019 whose principal provisions provided for a 30 day suspension and for Council member King to

to the second and third charges regarding conflicts of interest in disorderly conduct, the evidence presented demonstrated that Council member King misappropriated for his personal financial gain 2000 and of a 9500 Council one-time payment directed to a staffer in violation of the city's conflict of interest clause and Council rule 10.70 and 10.80. Council member King engaged in this corrupt scheme in July to August 2019 by awarding that large one-time payment to his staffer and demanding that staffer kickback 2000 of it to him. As to the fourth charge regarding violation of the resolution in disorderly conduct, the evidence presented demonstrated that Council member King has repeatedly acted in violation of the resolution that resulted from the 2019 disciplinary proceeding. He never paid the \$15,000 fine imposed on him, despite being sent a payment plan and then a second more favorable payment plan and multiple requests for payment. He refused to pay for intake the mandated training and he repeatedly flouted his obligation to cooperate with the monitor by routinely attempting to make hiring and employment status decisions without the consent of the monitor, refusing to meet with monitor or respond to her

there are numerous documents and a recording that also supported many of the charges. The committee was unanimous in its determination that all charges have been substantiated by a preponderance of the evidence. All of our findings on these charges are disturbing, but the lengths to which Council member King has gone to evade the sanctions and requirements of the resolution cannot be understated. In voting to impose the sanctions or requirements in the resolution at the full Council meeting on October 28th, 2019, I stated that a more serious sanctions and then suspension should be reserved for cases in which we don't think we have any alternative. Unfortunately, the committee finds that Council member King has shown a blatant disregard for rules and policies of the Council. This is now the third matter in which King's conduct has led to discipline Specifically, there were the genderby the Council. based harassment complaints in 2017 for which King agreed to a certain discipline. The 29 charges resulting in the suspension and imposition of the monitor, as well as finding and training and now this set of four charges all of which we have substantiated. Last year, this Committee made every
