Democratic Conference, my name is Laurie Cumbo and I am the Majority Leader of the New York City Council.

We are here today to consider Rodney Pepe Souvenir for appointment as a Democratic Commissioner of Elections for Kings County. This position is to fill a vacancy created when the prior Democratic Commissioner for Kings County resigned earlier this year. According to New York Election Law, Section

DEMOCRATIC CONFERENCE OF THE 1 COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NEW YORK 2 3204.4, we as the members of the New York City Council who are members of the Democratic Party may 3 4 appoint any eligible person to fill this vacancy. 5 Eligibility requirements are limited to being a registered Democrat and a resident of Kings County. 6 7 The person appointed will fill the remainder of a four-year term expiring December 31, 2020. 8 Commissioners receive a \$300 per diem for each day of 9 attendance at DOE meetings or any of its committees 10 with a maximum of \$30,000 per year. Ms. Pepe 11 Souvenir was subject to a full background 12 information. No adverse information, conflicts of 13 14 interest or compatibility of office concerns were 15 identified. Ms. Pepe-Souvenir is a registered 16 Democrat and a resident of Kings County so she meets the eligibility criteria. Today's meeting will be 17 18 governed by Robert's Rules of Order, would any 19 Council Members like to be recognized prior to a vote on this nominee? And I will ask at this time if the 20 Parliamentarian will inform me if any members have 21 22 asked to speak? 23 PARLIAMENTARIAN: No, not at this time

In our 11 conversation, she agreed that long lines, broken 12 machines, voter registration, absentee ballot 13 14 failures are an impediment to voting that has 15 disenfranchised countless voters who might not 16 return. She has agreed to focus on expanding the number of early voting sites, reducing long lines, 17 18 fixing broken voter machines, commitment to register any and all voters even those who have only been 19 residents for 30 days not precluded by state law, she 20 will support the implementations of laws that I have 21 22 offered to enfranchise voters including local law 238 23 of 2017 to provide online voter registration, local law 65 of 2016 that would provide tracking for 24

absentee ballots from request to mail-in to receipt

This is specifically needed to help the 95,610 voters in Brooklyn whose This law has, absentee ballots were never received. since our conversation, been implemented for the most part. She is going to define the voter verifiable paper trail and plans to take on an active role of the Brooklyn Board of Elections. As Commissioner, she will work with local elected officials by her coworkers and translators for Russian, which my colleague Mark Treyger and I have fought for and Creole that are not as required by the Voting Rights Act. She has heard my concern that a patronage and a culture of incompetency have apparently broken the Board of Elections and as a Director of Diversity and Compliance as CUNY, she has the experience to enforce the anti-Neptunism laws and to manage and provide training for employees for failing on the job. Where all else fails, she is committed to working through the disciplinary process until its resolution so that everyone is working toward the best election. knows that the reform of the Board of Elections is an uphill battle. The board has equal representation amongst Democrats and Republicans. The Commissioners who are approved by the Council who did keep their

The Board of Elections, is especially in Brooklyn has be fraught with issues and we would be wise to not ignore them and while I believe that these issues are systematic the City Council can do more to make sure we ask uhm you know at least more aggressive or comprehensive vetting process that allows for the public to hear the candidates speak on issues that are important to them, uhm so that we can be transparent and they can have faith that the Board of Elections is going to ensure the foundation of democracy which our elections. After the speaker allowed us to meet with Ms. Pepe-Souvenir through the Brooklyn Delegation many questions were answered satisfactorily. It is somebody that I think we are going to be part of for a time to come and I am looking forward to seeing her time as a Commissioner in Brooklyn and I hope moving forward that we continue this process or a more complex process that allows us to vet these candidates so we don't have, what we seen in Brooklyn which is not only the purging of hundreds of
