SERGEANT JONES: Good morning everyone, and welcome to today's remote New York City Council hearing on Committee on Women and Gender Equity.

Thank you so much. Good afternoon. I am Council

Member Helen Rosenthal. My pronouns are see her

first, Chair of the Committee on Women and Gender

Equity, and for the record I would like to note

that we are joined by Council Members Koslowitz,

Ayala, Lander, Kallos, Majority Leader Cumbo. Thank

you all for joining us today. Today the committee

will vote on two resolutions, Resolution Number

923, which would declare the City Council's support

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for S2243-A654 sponsored by Senators Hoylman and Assembly Member Paulin, which repeals Penal Law Section 240.37 known as walking, the Walking Mile Trans Van. Also, Resolution 1444-A, which would call the New York State Legislature to pass and the Governor to sign a bill to amend the Criminal Procedure Law to allow convictions for loitering for the purposes of engaging in prostitution Offense, Penal Law Section 240.37 to be sealed and have the law apply retroactively. We are here today for a simple reason Penal Law Section 240.37 known widely as the ban on walking while trans needs to go. The data related to Penal Law 240.37 is simple and paints the picture of a large systemic and racist problem. In 2019, more that 90% of the arrests involved trans women of color. We already know that trans women of color. We already know that trans women in New York City have been targeted for over four decades under this statute that is just too broad, and at last week's hearing on these two resolutions we hear heart breaking first hand accounts of how this law has impacted our fellow, our fellow New Yorkers. Available date reinforces the stories we have heard about the

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disproportionate and dire consequences. We have seen that this law also disproportionately impacts immigrants and particularly trans immigrants. majority of arrests under this statute occur in five police precincts all predominantly black and brown low-income immigrant neighborhoods. While a violation under 240.37 can bar individuals' play, it's important to note that a violation under Section 240.37 can bar individuals from becoming a permanent resident of obtaining Visas. Enough is enough. I commend Council Member Rivera on these two important resolutions of which I'm a proud sponsor, and want to thank the advocates for your tireless dedication, advocacy and partnership. Before I turn to Billy Martin to call the roll on the vote I would also like to thank my staff Chief of Staff and Departmental Legislative Director Madhuri Shukla as well as the committee staff for their work in preparing for this hearing Brenda McKinney, Counsel Chloe Rivera, Senior Policy Analyst, Monica Pepple Finance Analyst, Elizabeth Arts, Community Engagement and John Blosco, the Council's LGBTQ+ Liason. Billy, when you're ready could you please call the roll.
