SERGEANT JONES: Good morning everyone and welcome to today's remote hearing of the Committee on Public Housing. At this time would all panelists please turn on their videos, and to minimize interruptions please place electronic devices to vibrate or silent, and thank you for your cooperation and Chair, we are ready to begin.

ALICKA AMPRY-SAMUEL: Good morning everyone, and thanks for coming. I am Council Member Alicka-Ampry-Samuel, Chair of the Council's Committee on Public Housing. We are here to vote on Proposed Intro No. 1911-A sponsored by Council Member Torres in relation to the provision of information to residents of the New York City Housing Authority regarding the mold ombudsperson. The bill was originally heard by this committee on October 7th of this year. At that hearing the committee sought to better understand NYCHA's efforts to address chronic mold and weak problems in their developments. Despite the

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quote/unquote Mold Buster Program the appointment of a special master and other changes to NYCHA process for remediating mold conditions, these problems have persisted. In 2018, an independent mold ombudsperson was appointed by the court to provide additional resource to NYCHA residents whose mold problems are not adequately addressed. At the October hearing the committee heard from resident leaders and advocates about the value of the Mold Ombudsperson. The Ombudsperson helps address resident's concerns when NYCHA has failed to address mold issues, and is empowered to hold NYCHA accountable to its mold related responsibilities. Many NYCHA residents remain unaware of the mold Ombudsperson existence or may not know the Ombudsperson is an independent appointee separate from NYCHA. Proposed Intro Number 1911-A would require the Administration to distribute information about the Mold Ombudsperson to every single NYCHA resident. This will help ensure they have access to every resource available to them, and will hopefully move NYCHA towards better resolving its chronic mold and leak problems. I am joined today by Council Members Menchaca, Diaz, Senior, Van Bramer, Ayala, Gjonaj, Gibson, Salamanca, and
