CHAIRPERSON COMRIE: Members have things to do and schedules to keep and while I know we have to allot time, you know, I will endeavor to be here early and on time for every

Item, Ignizio and Lanza [phonetic] in Staten

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Island, normally I vote for down-zoning because the down-zoning maintains the character of the communities and it doesn't allow for over development, it doesn't allow for skyscrapers and disrespect for the characters of a community. in this particular case there is a Black church in that community and they're still trying to work out the details on building housing. Some of the church members are for it. Some are against it. They're working up alternatives to building housing and whether or not it can be--it's three stories right now, they wanted to do a 4-story senior citizen housing there. Since that is swirling, I don't think it's good to just go ahead and down-zone until those things are resolved. come to the Committee now, knowing that a downzoning would really eliminate other--or make it very, very difficult if almost impossible to build the senior citizen housing that maybe some of the church members want to happen, I think that those negotiations should have been resolved before we come and do the down-zoning that would make it difficult or almost impossible for this senior housing to occur in that particular Black church

MR. MARTIN: Weprin.

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COUNCIL MEMBER WEPRIN: Aye on all.

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MR. MARTIN: Williams.

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COUNCIL MEMBER WILLIAMS:

please be excused to explain my vote? I also want to extend congratulations to the new Chair. I'm looking forward to working with you and doing some great things. I had my first Subcommittee hearing meeting with Chairman Brad Lander yesterday and I also wanted to say that I was very--I felt very great that I could also vote aye on providing historic landmark to the Lamartine for the Abolitionist work and also they brought up the fact and began discussing the lynchings that happened in New York City and I was very happy because of that. A lot of people think of New York State and New York City as anti-slavery but there was a lot of pro-slavery things going on and a lot of lynchings that -- and things of that nature that get attention brought to it.

Also I am going to vote aye on all but there was one that concerned me, 147 8<sup>th</sup> Avenue House. And I was just concerned to try to, again,

2	wish that the LPC work with that homeowner to make
3	sure the cost to her is as minimal as possible.
4	[Pause]
5	MR. MARTIN: Halloran.
6	COUNCIL MEMBER HALLORAN: May I be
7	excused to explain my vote? Mr. Chairman, first
8	I'd like to congratulate you on becoming our Chair
9	and I'm glad that as a fellow Queens' member, you
10	know, we'll be working together. The other thing
11	I'd like to say is it's great. Yesterday I was
12	had the pleasure of having Charles Barron to my
13	right on an issue and today I get to sit in the
14	majority seat. So I'm doubly, doubly pleased that
15	things have progressed so far and that the City
16	Council has come such a long way to including
17	diverse representation. Thank you very much. I
18	vote aye on all issues.
19	MR. MARTIN: Ignizio.
20	COUNCIL MEMBER IGNIZIO: Yes.
21	Consistent with my philosophy to vote against
22	Landmarking where the owners oppose, I vote no on
23	Land Use 145 and 147 and aye on all others.
