COMMITTEE: Public Safety

TITLE: A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York in relation to criminal street gang initiation activity. **SPONSORS:** Council Members Arroyo, Vallone, Recchia, the Speaker (Council Member Quinn), Foster, Gonzalez, Koppell, Koslowitz, Nelson, Palma and Rivera

SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION: This legislation would make engaging in any gang initiation activities that create, or threaten to create, the possibility of physical injury, death or physical menace, by criminal street gangs (defined in this legislation as "any ongoing organization, association, or group of three or more persons, whether formal or informal, that engages in criminal conduct as one of its primary purposes or activities") a Class A misdemeanor. The Council proposes to counteract the negative impact on communities of gang activity in general, and activities surrounding gang initiations in particular, as these have been found to involve either actual violence or threats of violence and have sometimes caused harm to innocent bystanders. The Council, therefore, proposes to insert a new section 170 into Title 10 of the administrative code of the city of New York making it a misdemeanor to engage in criminal street gang initiation activities.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This local law would take effect 90 days after its enactment into law.
