FISCAL IMPACT STATEMENT

PROPOSED INTRO. No. 59-A

COMMITTEE: Education

TITLE: A Local Law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to requiring the department of education to distribute information on obtaining a library card and a library card application to all students.

SPONSORS: By Council Members Van Bramer, Brewer, Chin, Dickens, Ferreras, Fidler, Gennaro, Gentile, James, Koppell, Koslowitz, Lander, Reyna, Rodriguez, Sanders Jr., Williams, Nelson, Lappin, Jackson, Recchia, Cabrera, Rivera, Foster, Crowley, Vann, Ulrich, Halloran and Ignizio

SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION: The Department of Education, in consultation with the public library systems, shall develop written or electronic materials containing information regarding each public library system and how students can obtain a library card. Such materials must include, at a minimum, descriptions of the library systems, a library card application, and instructions on how to obtain a library card. The materials shall be produced centrally and distributed to schools to give to every student entering kindergarten, grade six, and grade nine, as well as to every student upon his or her entry into a school as a new student. The department shall also ensure that the main office of every school has the library materials available for any student or parent who would like a copy.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This local law would take effect one hundred twenty days after its enactment.
