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CHAIR ROBERT CORNEGY: I proudly vote aye and congratulations to the bill's sponsor. (bell) Sorry I took so long, Margaret.

COUNCIL MEMBER CHIN: Thank you. Permission to explain my vote.

CHAIR ROBERT CORNEGY: Of Course.

COUNCIL MEMBER CHIN: I just want to say a few words about the bill. I really want to thank all my colleagues and all the advocates and the Committee staff. This took a very long time. supposedly part of the Lead Package last year because I guess the agency an bigger housing work together, but I think as Council Members, you know, we fight everyday for our district, and help our constituents improve their quality of life, and this piece of legislation is an important step to ensuring that no child must suffer because of poor oversight of construction in residential buildings, and in my district I think also it's Council Member Miller. We have a lot of old tenant buildings, and I think there are those kinds of old buildings across the city, and a lot of them, you know have lead, and there is so much renovations and construction going on. Even though the city's rate of lead poisoning has

- 3 par with the City's recommendation, and this, the
- 4 main part that this bill legislation, cooperation
- 5 | between agencies, between DOB and the Department of
- 6 | Health so that when lead is detected during
- 7 renovation and construction that immediate actions
- 8 | are taken, and that's very important because you know
- 9 the damage to a child is irreversible. So, this is
- 10 why it's so important that every child deserves to
- 11 live in a safe home free of environmental hazard and
- 12 | heavy metal. So, I thank my colleagues and urge you
- 13 to support, and I proudly vote aye. Thank you.

The Commissioner called me and it was like DOB said: Look, we can take a sample but that's a sample, but we can't do the testing, but then Department of Health can do the testing. So, they got to work together, but apparently Department of Health, I don't know if it's true or not, but they don't work on weekends(laughs) but DOB is here all the time. So, when DOB shows up and this bill require them in a complaint, they have to show up within 24 yours and they have to take a sample and then pass it on to Department of Health. sense, right?

When you get multiple agencies involved on the city, state and federal level it could be maddening and that is everybody's at fault and nobody is at fault, and that's if you don't want progress that's what you do. You put everybody in the stew and you don't make them work together. So, I want to hank you Council Woman Chin. Thank you Chair for advancing this bill and I proudly vote aye.

COUNCIL MEMBER GRODENCHIK: I hope that what we've done today has set a precedent, and we don't have to do this every single time. So, I'm hoping that this fire lit by Council Member Chin is one that kind of runs like wild fire throughout all the agencies, but to not want to do this and be embarrassed in this way.
