CHAIR DROMM: Okay, thank you very much.

Committee on Finance. I am Council Member Daniel

Dromm, and I'm Chair of the committee. I need the

Today the committee will be voting on eighth items:

Proposed Intro No. 2046-A, a Preconsidered

Introduction extending the Council's time to respond

to the Preliminary Budget, a Preconsidered

Introduction relating to she and thee (sic) our

property tax exemption renewals, an expense budget

modification, a revenue budget modification, a

transparency resolution and two Article XI property

tax exemptions. Proposed Introduction 2046-A

2 sponsored By Council Member Brad Lander would clarify and codify the existing requirement and practice of 3 4 the Mayor issuing capital commitment plans and Capital Project Detail Reports. The current language 5 6 of the Charter does not clearly delineate the 7 requirements and time line of the two distinct reports that are produced, and this bill would 8 address that lack of clarity. 9 The first Preconsidered Introduction, which I have sponsored, 10 would extend the date by which the Council must 11 12 submit its response to the Mayor's Preliminary Budget 13 from March 25th to April 1st. Currently the Budget 14 Response is due on the same day that the Charter sets forth for the end of the Preliminary Budget hearings. 15 16 In order to provide the Council with sufficient time 17 to prepare its response to the Preliminary Budget 18 after the conclusion of the Budget hearing the proposed legislation would extend the due date by one 19 20 week. The second Preconsidered Introduction, which I have also sponsored at the request of the Mayor's 21 2.2 Office would automatically renew for the next year 23 all senior citizen homeowner and disabled homeowner property tax exemptions to all properties that 24 25 received the benefit this year. The law would allow

2 the Department of Finance to require renewals in four instances where it is believed the property my no 3 4 longer be eligible for the benefit next year, 5 specifically if (1) the owner has died, (2) the Owner 6 has sold the property, (3) the Owner has added a new 7 owner to the deed or (4) the owner no longer uses the property as a primary residence. DOF estimates that 8 this would impact approximately 800 properties of the 9 55,000 properties that are receiving the benefit this 10 year. This preconsidered introduction was prompted 11 12 by the State's recently enacted COVID 19 Emergency 13 Eviction and Foreclosure Prevention ACT, and our 14 local law conforms with the authorities that the 15 state law afforded to us. Next, we have the budget 16 modifications. The Expense Budget Modification 17 represents movements of approximately \$1.1 billion of 18 funding between and within city agencies to reallocate appropriations in the City's Expense 19 20 Budget, and has a net impact of zero dollars. The Revenue Budget modification recognizes \$1.9 billion 21 2.2 of new revenues in Fiscal 2021, which combines 23 additional resources of \$421 million of prior year payables, and an adjustment to the General Reserve 24 25 will be used to prepay \$2.billion... \$2.7 billion

2 dollars of the Fiscal 2022 expenses. Next, we have the Transparency Resolution. The Transparency 3 Resolution sets forth the new designation and changes 4 in the designation of certain organizations receiving 5 6 local, Aging, Anti-poverty and Your discretionary 7 funding and funding pursuant to certain initiatives in the budget. As with all transparency resolutions 8 Council Members will have to sign a disclosure form 9 indicating whether or not a conflict exists with any 10 of the groups on the attached list. If any Council 11 12 Member has a potential conflict of interest with any of the organizations listed, he or she has the 13 opportunity to disclose the conflict at the time of 14 15 their vote. As a reminder, please disclose any 16 conflict you may have with Proposed subcontractors used by organizations sponsored by discretionary 17 18 funding. These disclosures must be made before the subcontractor can be approved. Disclosure forms must 19 20 be completed and submitted prior to the vote on the Transparency Resolution, and may be emailed to 21 2.2 Charles Davis. Finally, we have the Land Use items. 23 The first is 1045 Anderson Avenue in Council Member 24 Ayala's district. This action will revise the November 2019 Resolution passed by the Council 25
