CAROL CLARK: Thank you, Mr. Chairman and members of the Committee. As you noted, I am joined by Jack Hammer, who's the Director of Brooklyn Planning and Scott Short of Ridgewood Bushwick Senior Citizens Center. And LU 67 is known as Knickerbocker Commons, it consists of the proposed disposition of four vacant cityowned lots that are located, as you noted, at 295 Eldert Street and 797-801 Knickerbocker Avenue and they're going to be developed under the New York State Housing Trust Fund program. Under the proposed project, the sponsor, Ridgewood Bushwick Senior Citizens Council, Inc., will construct one 6-story building which will provide 23 low income rental units, plus a superintendent's unit. addition, the project will provide approximately 5,000 square feet of community facility space and parking.

Council Member Dilan has reviewed the project and has indicated his strong support.

5	a little bit about the program in which the

7	funding source, Housing Trust Fund?
8	CAROL CLARK: Sure, the New York
9	State Housing Trust Fund allocation for this
10	project is \$1.8 million and there's also New York
11	State low income tax credits, HPD has capital
12	funds in the project in excess of \$1.6 million,
13	Council Member Dilan has made a Reso A [phonetic]
14	grant of \$1 million, and there's a lender involved
15	at almost \$6 million, so that's the funding source
16	for the project.
17	CHAIRPERSON LEVIN: And with regard
18	to the AMI levels for the affordable units?
19	CAROL CLARK: Right, the income
20	targets are up to 60% of the Area Median Income,
21	which for an individual is \$32,200 a year, and for
22	a family of four, it's \$46,000 a year.
23	CHAIRPERSON LEVIN: And that
24	applies to all 23 rental units?
25	CAROL CLARK: That's correct.
