2	COUNCIL MEMBER RIVERA: Good
3	afternoon ladies and gentlemen, I'm going to be
4	reading the opening statement from Maria Del
5	Carmen Arroyo, since she's visually impaired at
6	the moment. Good afternoon, my name is Joel
7	Rivera, on behalf of Maria Del Carmen, she's the
8	Chair of the Committee. Today the Committee will
9	be voting on two resolutions: Reso 88, sponsored
10	by the Speaker, calling the Department of State
11	the United States Food and Drug Administration to
12	reverse their long-standing policy prohibiting men
13	who have sex with men from donating blood. And
14	second is Reso 39, sponsored by Council Member
15	Mendez, it calls on Congress to reintroduce and
16	pass legislation that would amend the Public
17	Health Service Act with respect to facilitating
18	the development of microbicides for preventing the
19	transmission of HIV and other diseases. The
20	Committee previously held a hearing on these two
21	resos on April 13 th , 2010, and I would like to
22	thank both the Speaker and Council Member Mendez
23	for their leadership in bringing these important
24	public health issues to the forefront. I will
25	briefly discuss both resolutions, Reso 80 pertains

to the FDA's long-standing ban on men who have sex
with men from donating blood. This policy fails
to take into account an individual's health
status, rather it represents a blanket prohibition
based on the individual's sexual orientation.
Other countries have relaxed similar prohibitions
and leading health and LGBT organizations support
reversing the FDA's policy, including the AMA, the
American Red Cross, the American Association of
Blood Banks, and the American Blood Centers.
Given the substantial need for blood donors, it is
counterintuitive to close off a substantial part
of the population from donating. We are
encouraged that the FDA has announced that the
U.S. Department of Health and Human Services
advisory committee on blood safety and
availability will examine this issue in June. We
feel that it is important to go on the record as a
city and make our voices heard.

Today we are also voting on Reso 39 which pertains to facilitating the development of microbicides for preventing the transmission of HIV and other diseases. It is estimated that women account for approximately half of all HIV

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and AIDS infections worldwide. Microbicides are a developing technology that will give women a preventative tool that they can control. Further investment in HIV and AIDS prevention too will reduce transmission of this disease, and microbicides in particular have the potential to empower women. I'd like to thank the staff of the Committee for their hard work at their assignment, and Joe Mancino, and I'd also like to recognize the members who are here with us today. We have Council Member Al Vann, obviously we have the Chair, Council Member Maria Del Carmen Arroyo, we have Council Member Debbie Rose, we have Council Member Peter Vallone, Jr. and Council Member Helen Foster.

Now over to the Chair.

CHAIRPERSON ARROYO: Thank you,

Joel. Is this on? You can hear? I guess I have

to explain why I'm visually impaired. Thank you.

You know, you take medication and they give you

all kinds of side effects, so some pain medication

blurs your vision. So that's what I'm dealing

with today. So with that, I think we are ready

for a vote. Unless any of my colleagues have any

4	the 13 th in my absence, thank you, Joel.
5	COUNCIL MEMBER RIVERA: No problem.
6	CHAIRPERSON ARROYO: Good backup.
