**PROPOSED INTRO. NO. 68-A**

**COMMITTEE: Housing and Buildings**

**TITLE:** To amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to civil penalties for unlicensed plumbing and fire suppression work

**SPONSORS:** Dilan, Fidler, Gentile, James, Koslowitz, Vann, Nelson, White, and Ulrich

**SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION:** This legislation would impose a minimum civil penalty and a minimum fine of \$2,500 for the first violation and \$5,000 for each subsequent violation for unlicensed plumbing and fire suppression work.

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** This local law would take effect 90 days after enactment, provided, however, that the commissioner of buildings shall take all actions necessary to implement this local law, including the promulgation of rules on or before such date.
