Lander. We're joined today by committee members
Rosie Mendez of Manhattan, Dan Halloran of Queens,
Annabel Palma of the Bronx, Gale Brewer and
Chairman Comrie is with us as well, and Council
Member Inez Dickens, who is hiding in the low
chairs over there.

Before I introduce Council Member Brewer to say a

few words before we vote, I just want to pause a

to the range of advocates who spoke with us.

This I think was a challenging issue for us. It wasn't a simple situation of a developer with a bulldozer and a treasured building. It was a question of trying to wrestle and grapple with competing values. The value of preserving architecturally significant buildings but also preserving the uses and indeed the spirit that make this city what it is. Our committee wrestled with it in a profound way.

I also want to give specific credit to Council Member Brewer also for not only presenting us with a situation that's about the regulatory power of landmarks preservation but about really thinking about stewardship and how we take care of the treasures of the city. So thank you for all of that, and with that I turn it over to Council Member Brewer.

very much, Chair Lander. Certainly you and Chuck
Meara and most definitely the chair of the Land
Use Committee, Leroy Comrie, have been stalwart
supporters of thinking about a better process and
have been very patient. I am deeply appreciative,
I think as is the west side community.

So I am supporting the landmarking of West Park Presbyterian Church at 165 West 86th Street. I think that the Landmarks Preservation Commission outlined the reasons for it and it's in your material. It is a building that is certainly worth of being landmarked.

Most importantly, it is a building on Amsterdam and 86th Street that means a great deal to the community. It means that we're home.

It means that we have a place to go that has lots 2 3 of importance to us. In terms of the mission of 4 that particular congregation, the history of that congregation, there's a history of progressive 5 It's a community that invited the LGB 6 7 community into the building long before others 8 It's a community that has always welcomed many, many, many groups and families into that 9 10 building. It's a congregation with a mission.

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I look forward to working with the entire community of the west side and beyond. It's a building now that does not have any activity in it because it needs renovation. look forward to working with the community board and all of the west side neighbors and friends to figure out a way to work on the mission as well as the preservation of this historic building so that it will be something that we can all be proud of well into the future.

So with that, I want to again thank the chair, both chairs, thank the Speaker's office and say how much I appreciate the work of the congregation and the community for making something very special that we can all remember

So I have changed my position. I am going to vote age to this with the understanding that Council Member Brewer has made tremendous outreach to this parish, has made a commitment to them to assist them in finding creative ways to plug shortfalls and to make things happen. This is an example, of where the government can do something right, on occasion, and does it with an eye to the future.

Inis church clearly is a historic landmark. There is no doubt about that. It needs to be protected and preserved. It needs to be protected and preserved in the context of the people of that congregation continuing their worship, their belief and as Council Member Brewer rightly points out, there are a vanguard of tolerance and forward thinking in their religious community. They are ahead of the curve, as they say, in many ways.

So with that being said, and with all due respect to my principles as a libertarian Republican, I will set those aside for the moment
