2	CHAIRPERSON DILAN: Okay, good
3	morning. I am Erik Martin Dilan. I'm the chair
4	of the City Council's Housing and Buildings
5	Committee. I'd like to thank everybody for
6	attending this hearing on the proposed Intro 68a
7	for the purposes of a vote. It's a local law to
8	amend the code of the city of New York in
9	relations to penalties for unlicensed plumbing and
10	fire suppression work in the city of New York.
11	The bill would amend the code to increase
12	penalties for those who perform plumbing or fire
13	suppression work without the required master
14	plumber's license or a master fire suppression
15	contractor's license. Currently, engaging in any
16	business or occupation without a required license
17	is classified as an immediately hazardous
18	violation. A license is required in the city to
19	perform plumbing or fire suppression piping work.
20	This bill would increase the fine or civil penalty
21	that can be levied for these types of violations
22	from not less than \$1,000 to \$25,000 to each
23	violation to not less than \$2,500 for the first
24	offense and not less than \$5,000 for each
25	subsequent offense. The bill has been amended

from its original version by lowering the civil
and criminal penalties from \$5,000 for a first
offense and \$10,000 for a subsequent offense to
\$2,500 for a first offense and \$5,000 for each
subsequent offense as I said in my opening. Also,
deleted from the bill, the bill deletes Section
Two, since the minimum criminal fines that may be
imposed were included in Section One of the
amended legislation, I would like to ask my
colleagues to vote in favor of this legislation
and would like to ask the clerk to call the roll.
