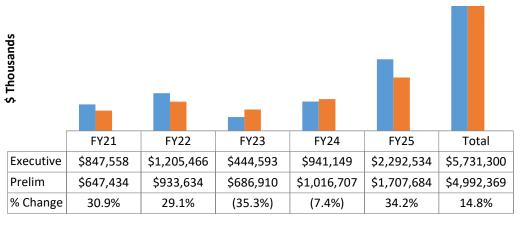

#### **Council Priorities Not Included in the Executive Budget**



- **\$20 million** for 300 maintenance workers;
  - \$3 million for 50 Urban Park Rangers;
    - \$6 million for 80 Parks Enforcement Patrol Officers;
  - **\$3.4 million** for 15 GreenThumb staff and materials for community gardeners;
- \$4.5 million for our natural forest and trails; and
- **\$2 million** for tree stump removal.
- \$10 million in capital funding to plant more street trees
