Today, we are hearing to preconsidered Resolutions to amend the rules of the Council. first, (excuse me, my allergies are very bad today), the first preconsidered Resolution would amend Rule 7.00A by changing the Membership and Chairmanships of certain standing Committees of the Council. rule change requires the majority vote of all Members of the Rules Committee and a majority vote of all Council Members. The changes proposed in the first preconsidered Resolution are Aging, Council Member Dinowitz; Civil Service and Labor Council Member Dromm is coming off and Council Member Dinowitz is
