COMMITTEE: Public Safety

TITLE: A Local law to amend the administrative code of the city of New York, in relation to sound permits.

SPONSORS:

Council Member Vallone (by request of the Mayor) and Council Member Lew

SUMMARY OF LEGISLATION: Current law prohibits the issuance of permits for the use of sound devices or apparatus in any location within five hundred feet of a school, courthouse or church, during the hours of school, court or worship, respectively, or within 500 feet of any hospital or similar institution.

This legislation would exempt applicants seeking permits in relation to sound devices or apparatus located in a fixed open air structure such as a band shell, amphitheater, stadium or similar permanent structure used for performances or events when such applicant certifies that the sound attributable to such sound device or apparatus will not exceed a level of 10 dB(A) or more above the ambient sound level as measured at a distance of 15 feet from the point on the perimeter of the property upon which the structure is located that is closest to the sound device or apparatus.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This local law would take effect immediately upon passage and expire ninety days thereafter.
