COMMITTEE COUNSEL: Thank you, Council So you'd like me to read the seven items Member. that we'll be voting on today?

CHAIRPERSON MAISEL: Yes, please.

COMMITTEE COUNSEL: Today the Committee on State and Federal Legislation will consider seven Home Rule resolutions. SLR 0001 of 2021 concerns the pensions of employees of the New York City Transit Authority who incur certain lung diseases during the tenure at the Transit Authority. SLR 2-2021 concerns modifications to the retirement program for certain Triborough Bridge and tunnel members to allow for earlier retirement for certain members who have completed 20 years of service. SLR 3-2021 concerns

critical street safety legislation. This legislation

2	will allow New York City to reduce the citywide speed
3	limit to 20 mph and add other street calming measures
4	to increase the safety of our streets. SLR 4-2021ces
5	a pilot program for mobile overweight vehicle
6	inspection on a stretch of the Brooklyn Queens
7	Expressway, which this council has noted is quickly
8	deteriorating. This will help extend the use of the
9	BQE by better enforcing weight restrictions for
10	vehicles. SLR 5-2021 will allow for the construction
11	of a storm sewer in Idlewild Park in Queens. SLR 6-
12	2021 will eliminate disparities in the calculation of
13	base pay for pension members of the New York City
14	Fire Department in tier two of the pension system.

Chair Maisel, I turn it back over to you to see if any council members have questions about these items before the vote.

And finally SLR 7-2021 will increase fines for parked

or unattended trailers on New York City streets.
