Good afternoon. CHAIRPERSON HOLDEN: am Council member Robert Holden, Chair of the New York City Council Committee on Technology and I would like to welcome you all to a vote on Intro 1152-A sponsored by my fellow Queens Council member, Peter Koo. Intro 1152-A establishes a 48-hour grace period to protect New Yorkers from being charged interest and other fees when they cannot make payments due to an electronic system failure. As many aspects of our lives become increasingly digitized, we also become vulnerable to potential cyber attacks or other technical system failures. For city governments, as well as the residents, such incidents could be devastating. For example, in March 2018, the city of Atlanta suffered a cyber attack that shut down municipal courts and left its residents unable to access critical services like water bills and traffic summonses payments systems. In May 2019, Baltimore suffered a ransom where attack that froze thousands of government computers and disabled dozens of government services. In December 2019, a cyber attack affected the city of Pensacola would shut down 1

telephone systems, Internet servers, and online payment systems and sanitation and energy departments. Right here, in January 2020, the state of New York's computer network suffered a large cyber attack that temporarily knocked out access to several vital databases precisely as the state was gearing up to deal with the COVID 19 pandemic. Most recently, in June 2021, New York City's law department had been hacked and lawyers were struggling to gain access to important documents. Others cyber attack victims include New York's Metropolitan Transportation Authority and park mobile and mobile parking applications for street parking payment systems. some websites maintained by New York City agencies handle online payments by credit card, people and businesses must not be penalized for technical system failures beyond their control. With proposed Intro 1152-A, if a city website used to make online payments is disabled due to an electronic system failure, a 48-hour grace period would be established to ensure that people and businesses can make payments following the restoration of the website without incurring any late fees or interest. simple, yet common sense bill will go a long way in
