3	CHAIRPERSON WEPRIN: Could I have
4	everyone's attention, please? A little quiet in
5	the chamber? [background noise] Thank you.
6	Ladies and gentlemen, good afternoon. This is the
7	continuation of the recessed Zoning and Franchises
8	Subcommittee, that meeting was held in hearing on
9	June 21 st , on the Domino Sugar issue, in Brooklyn.
10	Land Use No. 130, 131, 132 and 133. My name is
11	Mark Weprin, I am the Chair of the Committee, and
12	I'm joined by the following Members of the
13	Committee, Joel Rivera, Al Vann, Leroy Comrie,
14	Larry Seabrook, Bob Jackson, Diana Reyna and
15	visiting us Sara Gonzalez on the Committee, and
16	Vincent Ignizio, who is here. [pause] Since we
17	last met, there have been some modifications to
18	the plan, in response to our very long hearing.
19	Some of the issues that were raised by the
20	community, and by some of the other advocates in
21	the area, as well as discussion with the
22	proponents of the project, and the following are
23	the modifications that are being included in this
24	plan. Number one, to restore the height to the
25	commercial building on Site A, that was originally

in the building. Two, the two 40 story buildings on Sites B and C are going to be reduced to 34 stories. Three, there will be a dedicated shuttle bus service between the, to the Marcy Avenue subway station. Four, any change in the use of the space presently programmed as community facility, shall constitute a major modification and shall have to go through the ULURP process again. And five, a community advisory board will be created. Any comments or questions from

Comrie would like to make a comment.

COUNCIL MEMBER COMRIE: I want to congratulate all of the parties that were involved in putting this together. I want to congratulate Council Member Levin, and all of the work that he did, all of the people that were involved in this project. This is a significant project, that will change the face of that community. I want to congratulate the Land Use staff, Gail Benjamin, and all of the people, and our great Subcommittee Chair who helped make sure that this was shepherded through properly, Mark Weprin.

Clearly, as we move to ensure that we have more

people within our City, and we have more people
desiring to come into our City, that we allow
this, the process to make that happen, a process
that's inclusive of all the voices that Council
Member Weprin ran an excellent Subcommittee
Hearing, allowing all voices to be heard, and all
sides. And I want to just thank all of the people
that participated and came to the Subcommittee
hearings, also. Thank you.

CHAIRPERSON WEPRIN: Thank you,
Chairman Comrie, right back at ya, on the thanks,
and also want to thank all the staff for all their
hard work. And Council Member Reyna would like to
make a statement.

COUNCIL MEMBER REYNA: On behalf of our community of Green Point Williamsburg, representing these communities, this is part of a 2005 FUCA, which was the follow up correct action, that we worked hard to rezone, concerning the Domino Sugar Plant, which at one point had employed from our communities, well over 6,000 workers. And I'm happy to say that this particular land is going to be reinvigorated. I believed in this project, my community believed in

this project, and we are happy to see that this has reached a level of satisfaction. I want to thank Council Member Levin for his extraordinary work, and the work of the staff at the Land Use Committee, as well as you, Chair Weprin, and Chair Comrie. Thank you so much. And our Speaker, Speaker Quinn.

CHAIRPERSON WEPRIN: Thank you,

Council Member Reyna. Anybody else? I see we're

joined by Council Member Steve Levin who

represents the district, and he'd like to get in

on the fun and make a quick statement. [pause]

Is that on? Is that mic on?

COUNCIL MEMBER LEVIN: I think it is, yeah. So, I'd like to thank Speaker Quinn, Assemblyman Vito Lopez, Mayor Bloomberg, Council Member Domenic Recchia, Land Use Chair Leroy Comrie, Subcommittee Chair Mark Weprin, Gale Benjamin, and the entire Land Use staff, Carol Shine, Amy Levitan, everyone that worked on this project for all their tireless work. Since I began working on the new Domino Project almost four years ago, as Chief of Staff with Assembly Lopez, the goal has always been to bring the

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maximum number of affordable housing units to the Williamsburg community. I'm pleased to say that we have come to an agreement with the developer, to continue to provide 660 units of affordable housing while reducing the height of the larger two towers, which would have blocked the waterfront. In addition to providing the community with affordable housing, the developer and the Administration, the Bloomberg Administration, have also agreed to work with the community to mitigate infrastructure, traffic and transit impacts caused by increased development in recent years, and the Administration has pledged to work with the neighborhood to bring a cultural and community center for local arts organizations, and to provide the community with better open space options. I look forward to entering into good faith negotiations with both CPCR and the Administration, on a continuing basis to ensure that Williamsburg continues to thrive. very much, Mr. Chairman.
