Landmarks, Public Siting and Maritime Uses is

had as possible. And I'm pleased to recognize her
at this time.

we're about to approve an application for the
siting of a middle school in a community that for
decades has been struggling to make this dream
come true. And as a community, collectively, we
are not happy that it's not as big as we would
like it to be. But in, in a way, it does help us
get to a place where we can provide the middle

The School Construction Authority, who was not very flexible at first, but we were able to be very persuasive in the process of, of getting them to give us a school design that would allow us to build a 4,000 square foot green roof

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      laboratory for our students in that community.
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      And, and the School Construction Authority,
      Lorraine Grillo, were un--incredibly supportive at
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      the end of the process. The Deputy Mayor,
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      Walcott's office, Gregorio Mayer [phonetic].
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      my colleagues in government--without their support
      I don't know that we would have gotten to this
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      place, the Borough President's Office, and in
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      particular Jessie Mojica, his Director of
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      Education at The Bronx Borough Office.
      Assemblywoman Vanessa Gibson and her staff.
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      colleague Helen Diane Foster. She and I share
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      this community in common, and, and she in
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      particular is a resident of that community, and
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      understands the decades of struggle that this
      community has undertaken to get this school. And
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      our community advocates, they're in the back with
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      the signs.

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      community, the tenants associations, our clergy.
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      And I want to especially recognize a couple of
      individuals who attended every single meeting that
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      we had as representatives of the community, to
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      ensure the community's voice was always heard.

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      Gonzalez, who came to provide public testimony at
      our hearing last week. And I want to also
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      recognize Carlton Curry, the PA President for
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      District Nine, and Jose Gonzalez, I said, and
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      Wendell Jackson, from Community Board Four who is
      actually a new Chair of that community board.
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      And, you know, there's just been so many
      individuals involved in getting us to where we're
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      at today. I am very happy and proud that we will
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      be able to deliver to the Highbridge community a
      school that you can be proud of. A school that
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      will serve as a model for learning and design in
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      our City, and will probably be the second school
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      in the City with a green roof. So,
      congratulations, Highbridge. And I encourage my
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      colleagues to vote yes.

      range of modifications and enhancements to the
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      project, so that it'll be able to house the green
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      roof and sort of science exploratory roof that,
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      that Council Member Arroyo discussed. And to make
      those changes, which I won't go into detail,
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      structural in the building. The cost of those
      items is estimated to be $1.5 million, there'll
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      still need to be additional resources to really
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      build out the green roof, but this will, will make
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      it possible. So, a very significant
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      accomplishment. I also want to congratulate the
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      community advocates who were very persuasive at
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      the Committee, and echo Council Member Arroyo's
      thanks to all the parties--civic, political,
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      School Construction Authority -- who helped make
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      this happen. And the Chair recommends a vote of
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      aye. Asks the Counsel to call the roll.
